

GSA Allows \$10 Million For Construction Work

The General State Authority, the borrow-and-build branch of the state government, has approved allocations totaling \$10,625,000 for building construction at the University.

With the projects approved, architects will be named to work with University and GSA officials to prepare plans for the buildings, which bids will be requested and contracts awarded.

The program includes:

Construction of laboratory buildings and facilities for agricultural research including a meat processing laboratory and swine laboratory, located in the livestock area on the farms, and turkey brooder and breeding houses, located near the present poultry plant, \$1,250,000.

Construction and alterations for general engineering building which includes the removal of the Petroleum Refining Laboratory, near the main campus gate, and the construction of a new Petroleum Refining Laboratory south of Forestry Building, and the construction of an engineering building along W. College avenue, extending from Burrows road to site of the present Petroleum Refining Laboratory, and joining Main Engineering Building, \$5,975,000.

Home Ec South Building

Completion of Home Economics South, formerly the Textile Chemistry Building, with the addition of north and south wings, \$1,650,000.

Construction of a military, air, and naval science building, located along Route 322, opposite the Garfield Thomas Water Tunnel and north of the Service Building area, \$1,750,000.

Two General State Authority projects now are in progress on the campus.

New Hospital Wings

Wings to the University hospital are nearing completion, with the west wing, which will house the dispensary facilities, now located in Old Main, as well as other facilities, expected to be ready for use before the opening of the fall semester, and the east wing, composed largely of additional hospital bedrooms to meet the needs of a growing student population, expected to be completed soon after the opening of the fall semester.

The Hall of the Americas, scheduled for completion before the opening of the 1957-58 term, is well underway. The building will have 65 classrooms, including two lecture halls, and office facilities for 110 faculty members.

Home Ec Study For Males Too

Home Economics was established as a field of learning in the latter quarter of the 19th century to provide education for a better home and family life.

Men and women with bachelor's or advanced degrees from Colleges of Home Economics are required for many positions in industry and educational agencies, on magazine staffs and in hospitals, in research laboratories, and in public food and housing services.

At the University space and equipment for the home economics program include a nursery school, a cafeteria and a tea room, four home management houses, and other laboratories for practice, experimentation and research, as well as the facilities of the entire campus.

The Home Economics curriculum which leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science, is approximately the same for all freshmen.

Osborne Sails Ocean, Draws The Sights

Milton S. Osborne earned himself the title of the "sketchingest seaman" aboard the Naval warship USS Albany this summer.

As the guest of the Secretary of the Navy, Osborne, professor and head of the department of architecture at the University, participated in the annual eight-week Midshipman Training Cruise Baker, designed to give college Naval ROTC students practical sea training.

During the Atlantic crossings and throughout his tours of Spain and Ireland, Osborne kept a day-to-day diary of his experiences in pen-and-ink, colored pencil, and water color. A running commentary in long-hand notes accompanied the sketches.

Interested in the everyday events in the lives of the 1,300 midshipmen aboard, Osborne spent much time talking to the men and sketching them as they went about their daily shipboard routine.

Osborne, who represented the University on the cruise, returned to this country by plane from Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, where the Albany spent three days of gunnery practice.

Woman Lieutenant Assigned to ROTC

1st Lt. Renee Rubin, the first woman to be assigned to the department of air science at the University, has been named to assist Col. Daniel F. Riva, professor of air science, in the supervision and operation of the new women's officer training program within the Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps program.

Lieutenant Rubin is one of ten highly-qualified WAF officers selected by the Air Force for assignment to 10 colleges and universities across the nation where the women's ROTC program will be introduced this Fall.

Offered Same Chances

The program will offer young women the same opportunities to gain commissions in the Air Force that are afforded young men who enroll in the Air ROTC course.

Lieutenant Rubin arrived in this country in August after serving at Air Force Headquarters for Europe at Wiesbaden, Germany. While stationed there, she had the opportunity to fly over all parts of Europe and to visit nearly every major city from London to Istanbul.

Los Angeles Native

A native of Los Angeles, Lieutenant Rubin attended Pasadena Junior College and the University of California at Berkeley. She received her bachelor of arts degree in technical criminology and continued her study for a master's degree, becoming the first woman to receive the master of criminology degree from the

University of California. While enrolled at the University, she was awarded the Pasadena Panhellenic Scholarship. She is a member of the California Scholarship Federation.

Commissioned in 1952

Upon graduation from the University, Lieutenant Rubin in 1952 was commissioned in the Air Force at Hamilton Air Force Base. Since that time, she has served with the Office of Special Investigations at Headquarters, U.S. Air Force and Headquarters, U.S. Air Force in Europe. She also was executive to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Communications, U.S. Air Force in Europe.

Lieutenant Rubin holds a private pilot's license and is a member of the International Association for Identification.
