

# Class Heads Aided By Advisory Boards

Activities of the junior and senior classes are governed by three class officers who are the president, vice president, and secretary-treasurer. Elections are held in March at the same time as the All-University elections.

The system of a class advisory board was instituted by the junior class in 1954 and now all four classes are aided

by class advisory boards. The board for each class is composed of the three class officers plus approximately 25 other members who are chosen by person interviews with the officers.

The boards act in the capacity of steering committees for all class activities and projects. The senior class advisory board aided in the selection of a class gift, class night exercises held the night before graduation, and the Senior Ball which takes place during Spring Week in May.

**Aids With Commencement**  
The Board also helps with plans for commencement exercises.

The class gift committee is selected from members of the board and it supervises the placing of ballot boxes around campus for gift suggestions sometime in April. Undergraduate students, faculty members, and townspeople, may make suggestions for a class gift.

Suggestions receiving the most requests are placed on the final ballot and only seniors may vote for the selection when they pick up their copies of LaVie.

**Serve on Board**  
Class night committee members are also on the senior advisory board and they arrange for a master of ceremonies, choose entertainment, and supervise the elections for recipients of senior class night honors including the valedictorian, salutatorian, and five men's and six women's awards.

The men's awards include class donor, spoon man, cane man, barrel man, and pipe man. This system was initiated in 1914 and has become a favorite University tradition.

The presentation of awards to women began in 1922 and in-

cludes a class donor, slipper girl, bow girl, mirror girl, fan girl, and class poet.

**Sponsor Junior Prom**  
Main project for the junior class is the Junior Prom which is in November. Last year, the junior class advisory board sponsored a Christmas party for more than 300 children of faculty members. The party was held in the EUB ballroom and marked the first time the board had undertaken such a project.

The boards meet about every three weeks and inform the president on student opinion in the class which might aid him as a member of All-University Cabinet and in coming to important decisions involving class action.

The Dungaree Drag, an informal dance scheduled for Oct. 6 in the Hetzel Union ballroom, has been canceled.
