

# Lions Top Bisons, 7-0, For 19th Straight Win

It must have been a long trip back to Lewisburg for the Bucknell soccer team Saturday afternoon.

The upset-minded Bisons not only became the 19th straight-victim of Coach Ken Hosterman's booters but they also suffered their 20th loss in the series between the two schools, 7-0.

In addition, the defeat marked the eleventh time that Bucknell has been given the whitewash treatment by the Penn State soccermen.

Actually, the score doesn't present a true picture of Penn State's domination on the field. The Lions completely manhandled the Bisons not only statistically but also physically.

**BUCKNELL WAS** so mystified by the actions of Hosterman's crew that they seemed to lose all hope of victory before the fourth period was underway.

Statistic-wise the local booters attempted 61 shots at the Bucknell goal and had 11 corner kicks. The Bisons, on the other hand, could get only 12 shots at the Nittany net in addition to their lone corner kick.

Sophomore Mike Stollmeyer and letterman Tom Nute led the Lion scoring attack with two goals apiece. Ward Hill, Jim Hedberg, and Per Torgeson also tallied for the soccermen.

**STOLLMAYER LIVED** up to Hosterman's pre-season expectations not only with his scoring effort but also with his deceptive ball handling and defensive work.

Nute wasn't even in the starting lineup but he saw enough action to rack up single goals in both the third and fourth stanzas.

Hill opened the Lion scoring with a goal from 10-yards out after ten minutes had gone by. Hedberg followed four minutes later with a 12-yard shot to give the Lions a 2-0 first period lead.

**TORGESON INCREASED** the margin to 3-0 midway through the second period with a penalty shot.

The Lions did not score again

until Nute ripped the Bucknell net with a third period tally. His shot came with 17 minutes left in the period.

Stollmeyer broke into the scoring at 5:40 of the fourth period with an 18-yard shot from midfield to give the Lions a 5-0 lead. Nute's second goal put the Lions ahead, 6-0, with 14 minutes left and Stollmeyer added the final point at the 15:50 mark.

**ALL OF THE** Lion booters came in for praise from Hosterman. He was especially pleased with the way the offense worked. "The only spot that worries me is at fullback," he said. "I don't think Bucknell gave my fullbacks a real test of their ability, but I still think they did a good job."

The Lion soccermen invade West Chester State Teachers College Saturday afternoon in quest of win number two of the season and their 20th over four years.
