

Sororities to Begin Rushing Program

Sororities will begin the informal rushing program this year with open house on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of next week.

Coeds who intend to rush should register in the office of the dean of women by 5 p.m. Monday. Second semester women are required to have a 2.3 average; all other upperclasswomen must have an All-University average of 2.0.

All women who register for informal rush are invited to visit any of the suites on Tuesday and Thursday, 1-5 p.m. and 6:30-8 p.m.; and Wednesday from 1-5 p.m. Sigma Delta Tau, Phi Sigma Sigma, and Alpha Epsilon Phi will not rush on Wednesday.

Floor plans of each dormitory will be given to the rushees in the lobbies of Grange, Simmons, and McElwain that designate the location of each sorority suite. Rushees are requested to wear their official Panhellenic Council name tags.

Sororities may be revisited during the open house period as many times as the rushee desires.

The regular rushing program will begin Oct. 14. Rushees may visit only those sororities to which they have been extended an invitation. Invitations will be received by the rushee in her mailbox. She will mark the hour she wishes to visit the suite and return it to the dormitory housing that sorority before noon of the following day.

Rushing will not be held on Saturdays and Sundays.

Bids for membership in a particular sorority will be extended through the office of the dean of women where it will be stamped with the official Panhel seal and mailed. The rushee will be allowed one week to return the answer in a stamped addressed envelope to the dean's office. A

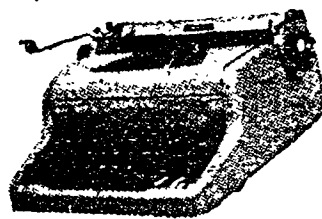

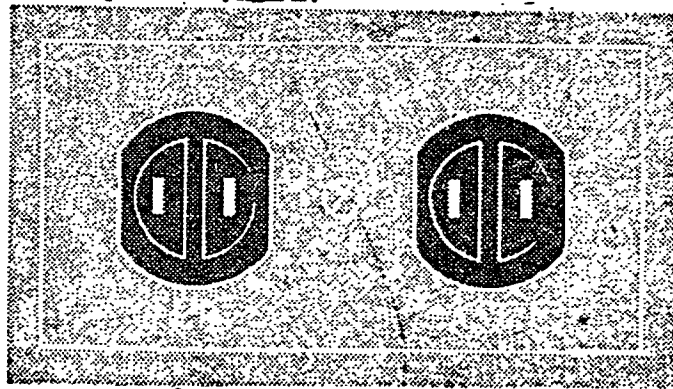

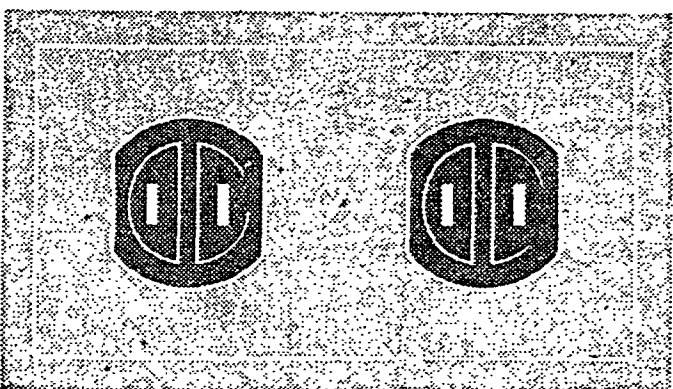
