Council president. "We shouldn't try to mock something we don't have and need (the U.S. federal government)." Land said. In order to serve on the court, he said, members should have a full knowledge of the student government constitution.

**Necessity Challenged**

"Is it necessary for these people to learn all the constitutional workings so they can use them twice a year? Why don't you clean your own shirts, Cabinet?" he said.

James Musser, workshop chairman, echoed Land saying the members of his workshop didn't feel the court was necessary at the University. "There's no danger of Cabinet becoming a tyrant," he said.

a good student-faculty ratio and a good average schedule per student. If courses are added at a great rate, one of these will "go out of kilt."

3. A recent educational research report stated that there should be more "fusion and less fission" of courses and expansion is tending toward "hardening of the categories."

In refute of Dr. Shelley's recommendation, members of Senate said that expansion powers "must be fluid" and "can't freeze science" since there are demands for courses "tailor made for specific purposes."

E. H. Freund, associate professor of philosophy, said that without the introduction of new courses the University cannot accommodate growth, change and achievement.

There is no justification to abolish this right, he continued, any more so than to declare a moratorium on free speech.

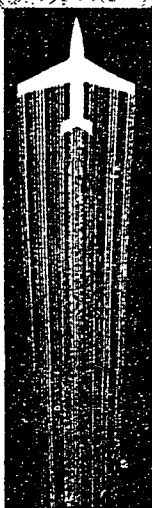
