The Senior Class Advisory Board will investigate the possibilities of exemption from final examinations for eighth semester seniors, according to Joseph Hartnett, senior class president.

The advisory board will meet at 3 p.m. tomorrow in 216 Hetzel Union to discuss the investigation.

According to Hartnett, past investigations by committees on exemption have suggested that an All-University average of 2.5 would be necessary for exemption.

The advisory board will report its findings to All-University Cabinet for consideration and further action.

The board will also discuss the possibility of a new senior class activity with the purpose of adding something new to the senior class calendar, Hartnett said.

In further action the advisory board will discuss the student encampment recommendation to eliminate the Supreme Court, which is now before Cabinet.

Since 1937, Miss Gullickson has been affiliated with the Veterans Administration, first as staff and head dietitian at the Hines, Ill., hospital and chief dietitian at the Wadsworth, Kans., hospital. Then, in 1944, she accepted administrative positions in the central office of the Veterans Administration in Washington, D.C. For the past eleven years, she has been chief of the administration section of the dietetic service of the Veterans Administration.

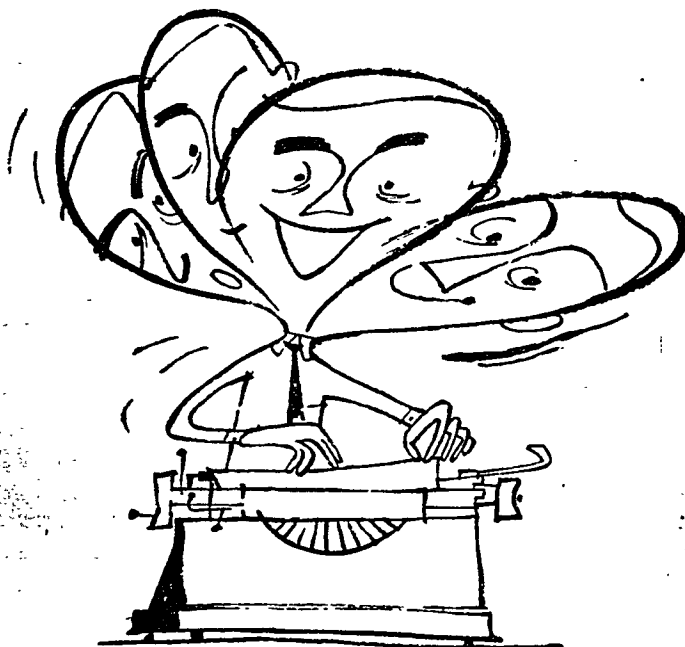

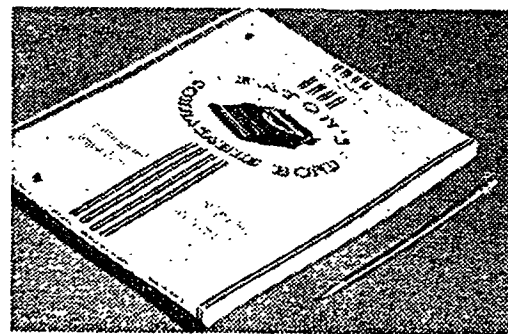
