said that student government does not need judicial review because "there is no partisan political philosophy." National legislative bodies are partisan in their make-up and Supreme Court review is necessary, he said.

The seven members of Cabinet

who are elected by the student body automatically drop their party affiliation when they take office, he explained.

"Each of us here is his own boss and lets his conscience be his guide," Howes declared. "Here we have an ideal group to make a non-partisan decision and no political axe to grind."

"This group should in the long run make the ultimate decisions," he concluded.

When Howes took his seat, Cabinet members broke into applause.
