

# Dulles Urges UN Session For Seeking Cease Fire

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Nov. 1 (AP)—Secretary of State John Foster Dulles tonight urged an emergency special session of the United Nations General Assembly to call for an immediate cease fire in Egypt.

Dulles put before the Assembly a resolution drafted after consultations with President Dwight D. Eisenhower and the National Security Council.

In his resolution, Dulles also asked the Assembly to recommend:

1. That Israel withdraw behind the armistice lines immediately.
2. That all UN members refrain from introducing war materials into the area. This applied to Britain and France which are going ahead with preparations to occupy the Suez Canal Zone.

3. Upon the cease fire taking effect, the Suez Canal be opened to free passage of ships.

4. The Assembly to remain in emergency session pending compliance with the recommendations.

Britain quickly rejected the Dulles' resolution. A British spokesman told newsmen that Britain believed the resolution would not meet the situation.

He said it would leave the Middle East in the same troubled state which has led to the grave situation.

**2 Nations Approve**  
The 23-nation Asian-African group met in private, and the chairman of the group, Ambassador Djafar Abdoh of Iran, announced after the meeting that "the draft resolution as a whole is agreeable to all the Asian-African nations."

Diplomatic sources also reported that a private agreement had been reached among key delegates to push for an early vote and leave the speeches of explanation until after the decision.

## Hungarians Resign From Red Pact

BUDAPEST, Nov. 1 (AP)—Hungary pulled out of the Soviet-dominated Warsaw Pact today and put itself under the protection of the United Nations.

Premier Imre Nagy announced a policy of neutrality and immediately protested to Moscow against movement of new Soviet troops into Hungary. He quickly told the UN about the new Soviet troop movements and set up a new defense command for Budapest.

## Security Group Meets With Ike

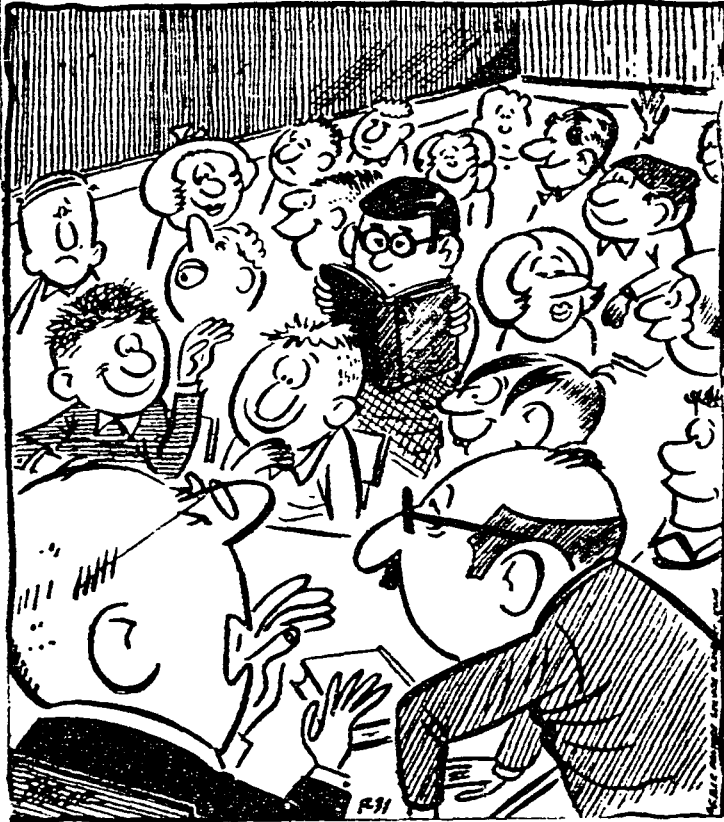
WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 (AP)—President Dwight D. Eisenhower met urgently with his National Security Council today amid mounting appeals from other capitals that the Middle East fighting be stopped.

A special message from Russia's Premier Nikolai Bulganin was reported en route to the White House, along with personal notes from the leaders of Egypt and India.

The President directed Secretary of State John Foster Dulles to fly to New York to lead the American drive.

Eisenhower and Dulles were reported banking heavily on the United Nations to adopt, by a two-thirds vote, a resolution calling on Britain, France, Egypt and Israel to stop the fighting.
