

# Three Fraternities Win In Intramural Swimming

Kappa Delta Rho, Beaver House, and Alpha Tau Omega splashed to victory last night in intramural swimming.

Bill Stevenson paced KDR to a narrow 21-16 victory over Phi Kappa. Stevenson took the 60-yard breaststroke unopposed in 55.3 to give Kappa Delta Rho its only individual winner of the night. KDR's Stevenson, Dick Muller, Jim Morgart, and Ned Lambert captured the 120-yard relay in 1:13.5.

Don Hale scored 10 of Phi Kappa's 16 points, winning the 60-yard freestyle in 34.6 and the 60-yard backstroke in 45.9. Phi Kappa's Ed Gruss copped the diving with 13.8 points.

Alpha Tau Omega, led by Ed Schwar, Harry Sloat, and Tom Seeman, crushed Acacia, 29-11.

Schwar annexed the freestyle race in 34.6, while teammate Sloat took the backstroke in 48.3. Seeman scored 13.8 points to lead the divers. Schwar and Sloat teamed with Bob Weil and Larry Baver to defeat Acacia's relay team in 1:02.3.

Mike Baker captured Acacia's only first place with 50.6 in the breaststroke.

Beaver House grabbed all five first places as it sunk a weak Alpha Phi Delta aggregation, 29-7. Jack Kilroy edged teammate Mel Sweeney to win freestyle in 38.4.

Sweeney added five more points with a first in the dive.

Fred Walchi stroked to victory

in 48.5 in the backstroke with teammate Bob Miller taking the breaststroke unopposed in 1:04.

Sweeney, Kilroy, Bede Bender, and Dave Miller completed the rout by taking the relay in 1:13.4.
