

Russian Tanks, Troops Drive to Isolate Hungary

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Nov. 2 (AP)—Russian tanks and troops encircled Budapest today and swept west in an apparent drive to seal off Hungary's frontier with Austria. They blocked a highway six miles from the Austrian border.

Premier Imre Nagy sent three notes to the Soviet Embassy protesting the rising Russian threat to this nation ravaged by revolution.

White House Calls Adlai 'Reckless'

WASHINGTON (AP)—The White House released today a statement saying Adlai Stevenson has shown "reckless disregard for known facts" in his attacks on the administration's record on health, education and welfare.

The statement was in the form of a report to President Eisenhower from Secretary of Welfare Folsom which was prepared, Folsom said, because "I felt it was urgently important for the people to have the facts."

Welfare Praised
"The plain truth is that in the past four years, more resources have been summoned to the cause of better health, education, and economic security than ever before," the report said.

Folsom quoted Stevenson as saying the Republicans "drag their feet on every proposal" to improve social insurance.

Social Security Cited
In fact, Folsom said, improvements sponsored by the Eisenhower administration are bringing more than \$1 billion of additional social security benefits this year to aged persons, widows and orphans.

Folsom said the new Department of Health, Education and Welfare was established 81 days after Eisenhower took office, whereas he said the Democrats "talked about" the idea for many years but didn't accomplish it.

Russian Tankmen, Hungarian Reds Hold Americans

VIENNA, Saturday, Nov. 3 (AP)—Russian tankmen and Hungarian Communists today held dozens of Americans, Austrians and other foreigners in villages near the Austrian frontier.

They were stopped by the Russians as they sought to return to Vienna from Budapest, the revolution-scarred, Hungarian capital.

Among them was a group of dependents of U.S. legation personnel from Budapest and wives of newsmen.

They started out from Budapest but were caught by Russian tanks within nine miles of the Austrian border.

The Russians told them it was "dangerous to travel at night" and they could proceed in the morning.

In Washington, State Department press officer Lincoln White said the department had been advised of the incident but had no details. He said a protest had been lodged with Soviet Ambassador Georgi N. Zarubin.

Weapons Shipments Banned

4-Point Mideast Program Suggested by Stevenson

DETROIT, Nov. 2 (AP)—Adlai E. Stevenson tonight came up with a four-point plan that he said "a determined American government could" use "to stop the war and strike a blow for peace" in the Middle East.

"Whatever the provocations," Stevenson said "aggression can no longer be tolerated in the atomic age."

Stevenson flew here today after making a noon-day speech in Cleveland.

He laid down this plan for peace.

"First, security must be restored along the frontiers dividing Israel from her neighbors. One root of all the trouble in the Middle East is that Israel's neighbors have denied her right to exist and have engaged in continual hostility and provocation against her. This must stop."

"Second, we should insist that passage of ships through the Suez Canal is a matter of international concern and that no single country, and especially no single man,

can willfully sever the lifeline of Europe and Asia.

"Third, we must launch an all-out attack in concert with like-minded nations on the problem of resettling the 900,000 Arab refugees who now live in misery and hopelessness.

"Fourth, we must in concert with other nations present a program to improve economic conditions in the Middle East for the benefit of the people and not just to serve political interests."
