They are German Villar, head of the Uruguay Commission for Atomic Energy, and Carlos Berta, dean of engineering and chairman of the Commission. Both are from the University of Montevideo.

The NSA coordinator reports the activities of the association to All-University Cabinet.

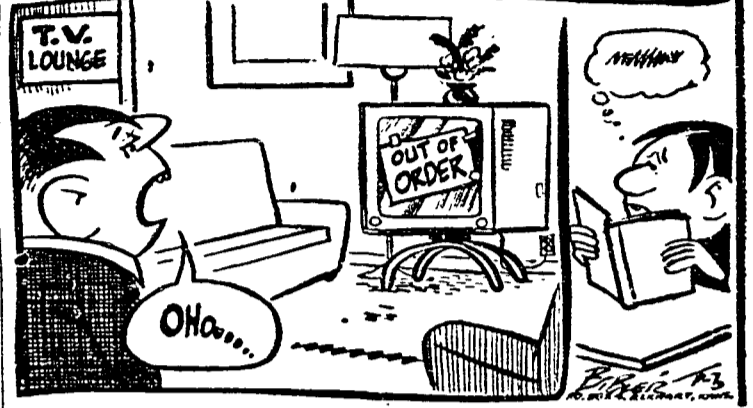
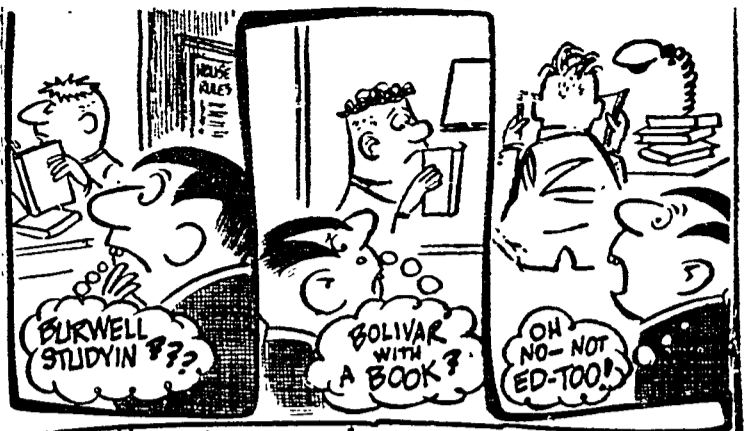
