

3750 Tickets Purchased For Marine Band Concert

Approximately 3750 tickets have been sold for the United States Marine Band concerts, Stephen Higgins, publicity manager of the concerts, said yesterday.

Tickets will be sold through the day of the concerts or until a capacity crowd of 6000 for each concert is reached, Higgins said.

David R. Mackey, State College burgess, has announced that he has declared Nov. 15 Marine Band Day in State College.

Symphonic Band
The band, the oldest military symphonic organization in the country, will present two concerts at 3:30 p.m. and 8 p.m. Nov. 15 in Recreation Hall.

Tickets for the matinee are 50 cents for children and \$1 for adults. Reserved tickets for the evening performance are \$1.50 and unreserved tickets are \$1. They may be purchased at the Hetzel Union desk, Waring Lounge desk, the Music Room, Sigma Chi fraternity, the Corner Room, and the bulletin board at the Mall.

Sponsored by Sigma Chi
The concerts are sponsored by Sigma Chi fraternity and the proceeds will be used to help support the U.S. Olympic team at Melbourne, Australia.

The band, conducted by Capt. Albert Scheopper, will present classical, modern, novelty, and martial selections at the concerts.

William Jones, vocal baritone and instrumental soloists will be featured.

Tour Covers 8000 Miles
Its appearance at the University is part of the band's annual tour of the North-Central section of the country, which covers 8000 miles and 163 cities. This is the only tour in which the band can participate in this year.

The 158-year-old Marine Band was organized in 1798 by an act of Congress. Known as the "President's Own" the band has played for every inauguration since Thomas Jefferson's.


