

# Booters Host Army in Final Home Contest

Army—minus the services of an air and naval bombardment which usually softens up the enemy's defenses before the main attack—invasives the Beaver Field soccer turf at 10 this morning to battle the Nittany soccer team in the final home tilt of the year for the Lions.

The Black Knights of the Hudson provide the first real opposition the Lions have had before a partisan home crowd at least that's the opinion of soccer coach Kea Hosterman.

In previous home exhibitions the Lions have had easy times in recording victories. Only Colgate was able to score against the Nittanians in a 5-2 defeat as Hosterman's eleven routed Bucknell, 10-0, and Syracuse, 8-0.

### Score Misleading

The Colgate score does not indicate the overall superiority of the Lions. Coach Hosterman's booters had a wide margin in the statistic department having 42 attempted goals to Colgate's 26.

But despite a mediocre 2-3-1 record, Army will be different. The Cadets have played two common opponents of the Lions, Colgate and West Chester Teachers. They defeated Colgate 4-1 but lost to West Chester 1-0.

Today's game will not be of the "excuse me I bumped you" type of play. In the West Chester encounter, the Cadets put two of the Ram's key players out of action. They were forced to miss the East Stroudsburg game which West Chester lost, 1-0.

Hosterman is not going to change the combination that brought the Lions a 3-0 win over Maryland last week.

### Lawrence at Goalie

John Lawrence, with four shut-outs to his credit this year, will be in the goalie post. Ralph Brower and Dave Davis will man the fullback spots and Ward Hill, Steve Flamportis, and Herb Hert-

ner will fill out the backfields at halfbacks.

The front line will have Jim Hedberg and Dutch Walz at the wings; Per Torgeson and Mike Stollmeyer at inside; and Tommy Nute in center forward.

Halfback Walt Krauser and center forward Dave Haas are Hosterman's first line reserves.

Goalie Don Dougald; fullbacks, Paul Bauer, Don Meyer, Tony Tremonte and Otto Rosenberger; halfback Jim Edmonds; and linemen Jim Benford and Bruce Walsh fill the rest of Hosterman's reserves positions.

### 3 Lead Scorers

If the Cadets expect to halt the Lions they will have to stop the scoring efforts of Torgeson, Nute, and Stollmeyer, who have combined for a total of 21 goals this year. Torgeson leads the pack with 10 goals. Nute has six and Stollmeyer trails with five.

The Lions will be after their fifth win of the season and their 23rd in the last 25 ball games. Only Pennsylvania's Ivy League leaders have been able to defeat the booters, winning a 3-2 decision.
