W. Stewart Goas of the General Extension Service said he infers from the study that the standards of instruction and grading are apparently constant between the main campus and the centers.

The average for the students from all the centers was 2.44 while at the centers, and 2.48 at the campus, he said.

The centers are evidently neither tougher nor easier than the main campus, for an all-university average of 2.46.
