The report, which was generally favorable toward continuance of the association, was prepared by a committee under the direction of IFC vice president Howard F. Thompson.

Of the 20 fraternities which are not now members of FMA, it indicated that 16 would be willing to join for at least a semester if all other fraternities did, but that four would not join under any circumstances.

One fraternity officer has said his house has received consistently better discounts over the past several years than have houses in the FMA program. He said that the organization of the association has had no influence on the dis-count rate given his fraternity. He also said he believed that.

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
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
