# Psych Prof Appointed Dean's Aide

Dr. Edward B. Van Ormer, professor of psychology, will serve part-time as assistant dean of the Graduate School, effective today.

His appointment as assistant dean was approved at the Saturday meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

### Earns Degrees

Dr. Van Ormer was born in Norwood. He received his BA degree from Juniata College and his MA and PhD degrees, both in psychology, from Columbia University.

Following his graduation from Juniata College, he served two years as a teacher in the public schools of Mount Union.

### Joins Faculty

He then served on the faculty of Wooster College, Wooster, Ohio; Juniata; Wagner College, Staten Island, N.Y.; St. Joseph's College for Women, Brooklyn, N.Y.; and Hunter College, N.Y., before he was appointed in 1936 as assistant professor of psychology.

Dr. Van Ormer's research interests have been in the areas of educational and psychological measurement, learning, child psychology, and instructional aids. He is a member of various professional organizations and is a fellow of the American Psychological Association.

# Collegian Alum Receives Grant From Columbia

Herbert G. Stein, a former city editor of The Daily Collegian, has been named recipient of the \$750 1956 Maxwell M. Geffen Scholarship by the faculty of journalism at Columbia University.

Stein, 28, was a 1951 graduate of the University. Since that time he has been a reporter on The Oak Ridger in Oak Ridge, Tenn.

Stein was born in Pittsburgh, and attended the University of Pittsburgh for two years before receiving his B.A. degree at the University. He served in the Army, 1946-47 and was on occupation duty for a year.

Maxwell M. Geffen, editor of Omnibook Magazine and a graduate of Columbia's School of Journalism, class of 1916, made a gift of \$15,000 to Columbia University to establish the scholarship in the amount of \$750 annually, to the student "best qualified in periodical journalism." This year's award marks the third annual Geffen Scholarship.
