

Colgate First Test For Lion Wrestlers

Colgate University's wrestling team—which has met a Penn State mat squad only once before—provides the opposition tomorrow night when Coach Charley Speidel's grapplers open the 1956-57 season at Recreation Hall.

The meet, scheduled to get underway at 7, is the first half of a Colgate-Penn State double header sports event. In the second part of the twin bill, Coach John Egli's cagers tangle with the Red Raider floor quintet.

The only time that the Lions have faced Colgate on the mat was in 1944. Penn State won that match rather handily, 29-5.

Colgate invades the Nittany Vale tomorrow with two matches already completed. Coach Harvey Potter's Red Raiders beat Rochester Institute of Technology, 14-12, in their season inaugural, but lost to Cornell, 22-5, in their second meet.

The Hamilton, New York, mat team is predominately made up of sophomores. Only three lettermen are back from last year's team, and one of those veterans has been benched by a sophomore.

Juniors Pete Newell, 177, and Paul D'Esterre, 157, head the Colgate cast. Newell is unbeaten in two starts this year while D'Esterre's mark is 1-1. He was victorious against Rochester, but came out on the short end in the Cornell fray.

Ted Tobias, 137, also lettered for the Red Raiders last season but he has been shoved to a second team position by Frank McCarthy a freshman monogram winner in the 1955-56 campaign. McCarthy lost both of his starts this year.

The 123-pound berth is held by sophomore Paul Martin. Martin, 0-2 for the season, is one of two out-of-state matmen of the Colgate starting team.

Bob Skripak, another freshman performer last year, is in charge of the 130-pound division. He is winless thus far this season.

Sophomore Dick Zimmerman is the 147-pound starter. He was stopped by a Cornell opponent in his lone appearance this year.

Skip Schult, another sophomore, handles the 167-pound class. He copped a decision against RIT but was beaten by a Cornell foe.

The heavyweight job is in the hands of sophomore Douglas Werner. His record is 0-1.

Dick McShane, 133; Norm Cooper, 157; and Dick Kelly, 177, have an outside chance to pierce this starting lineup. McShane and Kelly have already wrestled this year, losing to Rochester.

Brooklyn Trades 'Robby' to Giants

NEW YORK, Dec. 13 (P)—Jackie Robinson, one of the most controversial figures in baseball, was sold to the rival New York Giants by the Brooklyn Dodgers today for a reported \$30,000 and pitcher Dick Littlefield in a deal that startled everybody including Robinson.

Robinson, who will be 38 on Jan. 31, has talked often about retiring. Uncertain about his status in 1957, he asked the Giants for a few days to think it over.


ECAC Selectors Name Valentine, Plum to 1st Team

Captain Sam Valentine and quarterback Milt Plum were named yesterday to the All-Eastern College Athletic Conference's football team, according to the Associated Press.

The team is picked from the 73 football playing members of the conference. Army was the only other college to place two men on the team.

Penn State opponents named to the team were: end Joe Walton of Pitt, tackle Flay Goodwin of Army, guard Lou Lovely of Boston University, halfback Bob Kysky of Army, and halfback Jimmy Brown of Syracuse.

Penn State's soccer team blanked six opponents as it compiled a record of 8 wins, 2 defeats and 1 tie in 1956.

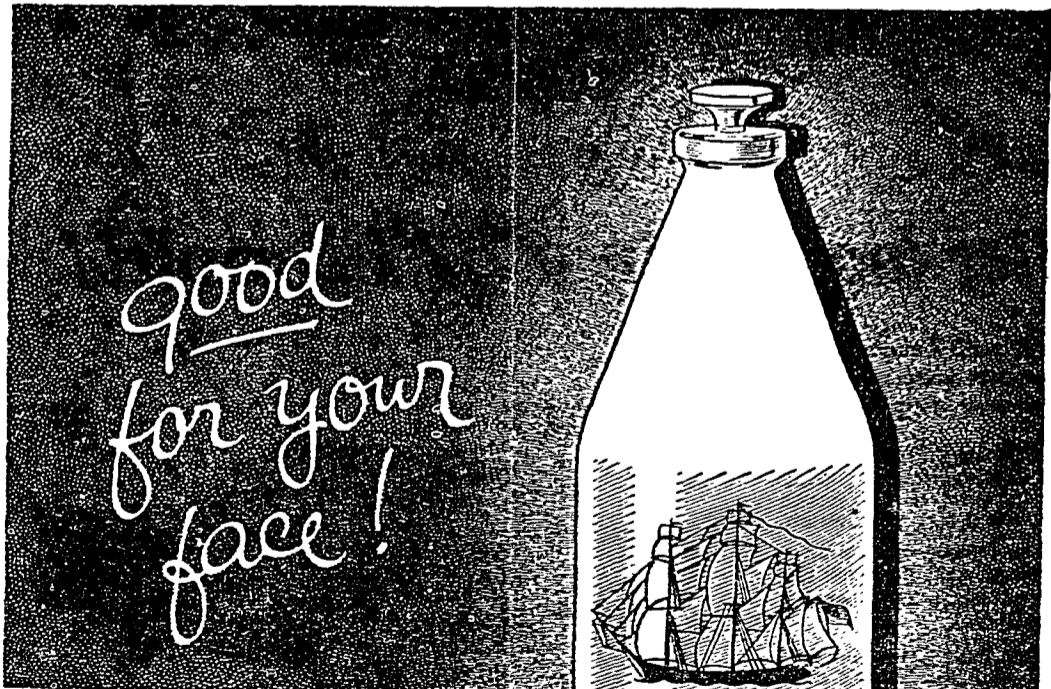
