

Sixteen to Attend UCA Regional Study Conclave

Eleven university students and five staff members of the University Christian Association will attend a regional study conference sponsored by the United Student Christian Council from Dec. 27 to Jan. 1 at Chatham College in Pittsburgh.

The topic to be discussed is "The University Under God." In order to understand this topic, the group will first read and discuss, in small groups, "Chosen People," a book written especially for the conference.

The conference is open to students of all denominations and non-believers. Applications are still available in the UCA office. The deadline for applications is Dec. 21. The fee is \$40, with some scholarship aid possible.

To Explain Christianity
The purpose of the conference is to explain what Christianity means, particularly to a university student. The student's relationship to his church in the university setting as well as his responsibility to the University as a Christian will be explained.

University faculty members attending the conference will include the Rev. Robert Starbuck, associate director of UCA and Evangelical and Reform Chaplain; the Rev. Arthur L. Ruths, Lutheran campus pastor; Ruth Bosch, assistant director of UCA and the Rev. Donald McIlvride, interim director of the Westminster Foundation.

Starbuck to Be Director
Reverend Starbuck will be the study director of the conference. Robert Hare is the student chairman of a committee of UCA students and faculty who are working to stimulate interest in the conference and to publicize it on campus.

8 Trees Missing From Memorial

Further investigation has shown that eight pine trees, planted along Curtin Rd. opposite the University flower gardens as part of a war memorial by the School of Forestry, are missing.

Only three trees were reported missing Wednesday. Capt. Philip Mark of the Campus Patrol said. Investigators were unsure whether five additional trees were stolen or that the previous investigation failed to reveal the complete loss.

A pine tree was planted for each member of the Forestry School killed in combat.

jured. The estimated loss in property damaged, wages and insurance last year was more than 97 million dollars, the Bureau of Highway Safety reported.

However, the National Safety Council reported Pennsylvania's death rate per 100 million miles traveled is 4.6, compared to a national average of 6.0.

The biggest death total on Pennsylvania highways was in 1936 when 2564 persons were killed.

As part of his education suggestions Neyhart said there should be special training programs for commercial vehicle operators conducted by the firm employing the operator. This would include trucks, busses, taxi cabs and other commercial vehicles.

"And not only should each community have a school driver education program, but there should be an adult driver education program in each community," he declared.

In addition, Neyhart said, the state must reinforce its vehicle

inspection program. "Compulsory inspection is wonderful, but we should also have spot checks to implement inspection. In that way individuals would be under pressure to keep their vehicles in top condition."

Turning to highways, Neyhart said one of the nation's prime problems is to set up an "adequate" road program. He said the national 300 billion plan is a step in the right direction, but added "our highways are 20 years behind the times now."

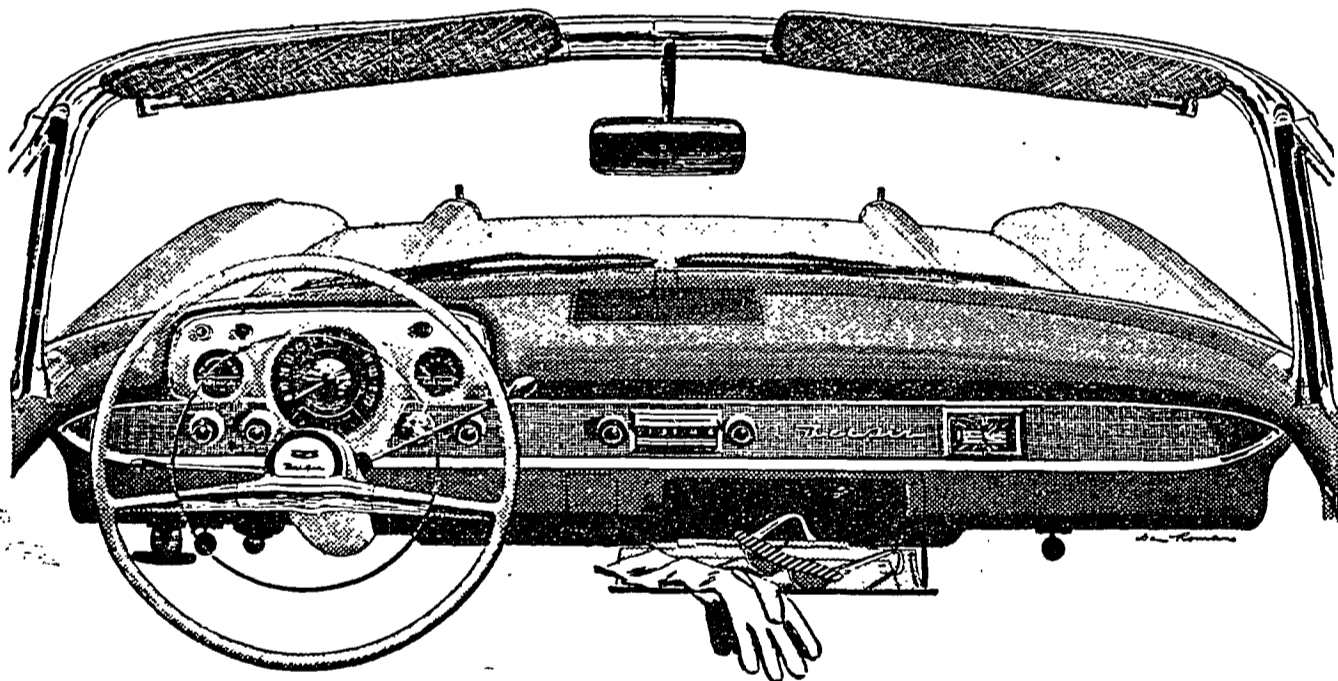

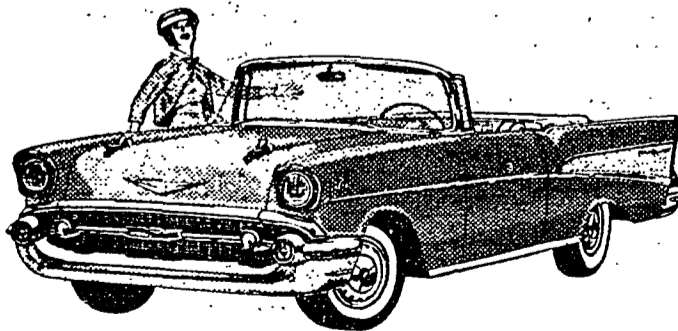
