

Ticket Sale Will Begin For Pre-Broadway Show

Tickets for the pre-Broadway production of "One's a Crowd" by Eugene Raskin will go on sale Monday afternoon at the Hetzel Union desk. Price is \$1.

The fantastic comedy will open its six-weekend run Feb. 22 at Center Stage. Tickets, however, are not available for sale is by invitation only.

"One's a Crowd" was chosen for presentation by the Penn State Players by the director, Robert Reifsnider, associate professor of theatre arts, from a selection of plays sent to the University by the New Dramatists in New York.

The New Dramatists are sponsoring a plan which assists talented new playwrights by giving them the opportunity to see Broadway productions, meet and talk with theatrical persons, discuss their plays and see their work in rehearsal.

Play is Drama "First"

The presentation of "One's a Crowd" is the New Dramatists' first attempt in distributing its plays to universities and community theatres.

Eugene Raskin, author of the comedy, is director of the advisory board of the New Dramatists and also an associate professor of architecture at Columbia University.

Author Visits Campus

During the play castings, Raskin visited the University to work with the director on script changes and to attend rehearsals.

Besides "One's a Crowd," Raskin has produced three other plays including "Amata," "The Last Island" and "Onward Viking."

"One's a Crowd" is the third original production to be presented by Players in the last three years. The first two, both written by University students, were "The First Day of Summer" by Bert States and "Pillars in the Night" by Bill Coleman.

Freshman Fined For Buying Beer

Fire Prompts \$1000 Award

Milo Wilson of Pleasant Gap, believing that a Dec. 14 fire in his barn was the work of an arsonist, has offered a reward of \$1000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of anyone who might have been responsible.

Convinced that the fire was arsonous, Wilson has raised a reward offer of \$50 to the present amount.

Wilson said that the barn was seen by a number of persons just minutes before the fire broke out over the entire length of the upper floor.

Since the whole side of the upper floor is covered with transparent plexiglass windows, Wilson said that a smouldering flame could be seen easily by any observers.

Wilson estimates his damages

at approximately \$40,000. He has requested that anyone having information that will aid in the investigation should write Post Office Box 494, Bellefonte, or notify him in person.

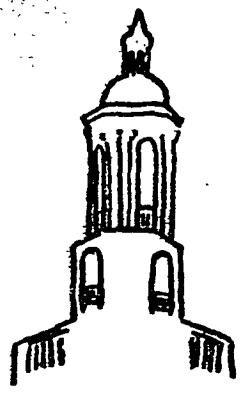
