

Ribboning of 236 Coeds Ends Rushing

Ribboning of 236 coeds by 23 sororities took place last night as the climax of spring formal rushing.

The ribbonnees represent 70 per cent of the number of women who began rushing last week. This is five per cent higher than last year's total, and the second highest percentage since 1948.

Delta Delta Delta ribboned the highest number, 22. Alpha Epsilon Phi and Kappa Alpha Theta were second with 18 each.

After ribboning at 7 p.m., the women thronged into downtown restaurants, talking and singing during the evening-long celebration. Some women had been reserving restaurant booths since 9 a.m. for this traditional climax of rushing.
