

IFC-Panhel Sing Rules Released by Chairmen

Rules for participation in the Interfraternity Council-Panhellenic Council sing to be held March 26, 27 and 29, were released today by Gail Kleppinger and Thomas Hollander, co-chairmen of the sing.

The sing will be the first of seven major fraternity-sorority events planned for this year's Greek Week to be held from March 26 to April 5.

Preliminary rounds for the sing will be held from 6:30 to 9 p.m. on March 26 and 27 in Schwab Auditorium. The winning choruses from each of the first two nights will compete in the finals which will be held at 7 p.m. on March 29.

Permanent trophies, rather than rotating trophies and plaques which were given to winners in previous years, will be awarded to the winning fraternity and sorority. Bronze plaques will be awarded to second-place winners in both the fraternity and sorority groups.

Trophy Rotated

In previous years, fraternities or sororities were required to win the sing for three consecutive years before they could obtain possession of a permanent trophy.

Last year, Tau Kappa Epsilon and Kappa Alpha Theta won for the third consecutive year, and retired the rotating trophies.

Participating groups, including the directors, must be regularly registered undergraduate students at the University. A group must be composed of at least 12 singers, not including the director.

"Whiffenpoof" Required

The required song for fraternities this year is the "Whiffenpoof Song" which may be sung with or without piano accompaniment. Each fraternity will also sing another number of their own choice which may be sung with or without piano accompaniment.

Each sorority group will also sing two numbers. The required number for sororities will be "Moment to Remember," which will be sung without piano accompaniment. The second number will be a song of the sorority's own choice. It may be sung with

or without piano accompaniment.

Dress Irrelevant

Hollander and Miss Kleppinger said that dress is optional and will not be used in the judging except as it may affect the judges in the general effect of the singing.

Judging will be based on tone quality, intonation, interpretation and phrasing, balance of parts, diction and general effects.

Deadline for submitting entry blanks for the sing is March 1. Hollander said that entries should be mailed to him.

33 Groups Participated

Last year, 19 fraternities and 14 sororities competed in the sing. By winning the sing, members of Tau Kappa Epsilon copped their sixth consecutive IFC-Panhel Sing title. They began their winning streak in 1951.

Phi Gamma Delta and Phi Kappa Psi were tied for second place last year. The other fraternity finalist was Phi Mu Delta.

Second place among the sororities went to Gamma Phi Beta. The other finalists were Zeta Tau Alpha and Delta Delta Delta.

The required song for fraternities was "Blue and White," and "Halls of Ivy," for sororities. Both groups also sang one song of their own choice.

The Newman Club will hold a "Hix Mix" from 8:30 to 11:30 tonight at the Catholic Student Center.

Admission will be by membership card or 50 cents. Dress will be old clothes.
