No one but Patricia Paladino could have portrayed the part of Ruth, Stephan's wife. She seemed to be the typical security-hunting woman, but at the same time put across a feeling of warmth which made it difficult for her to appreciate her systematic husband.

Although the first night's performance lacked a finished polish which will probably be added to the production through practice, Robert Reifsneider, the director, combined the skill of his actors and the oddities of the script into a pleasant evening for both Broadway and campus viewers.

Brightly colored sets by Russell Whaley added to the gay effect. It was also very well designed to allow for the freedom of movement used in several "fight" scenes.

A unique and clever touch was

added to the play by a radio broadcast which actually came from the table radio. The broadcast, announced by Scott Olmes, was arranged with the help of radio station WDFM.

Although the costumes were not unusual, they were effective. Also they apparently represented a rather large expense because of the duplicacy used throughout the play and also in the surprise end. Action was slow starting in the first act until Stephan arrived on the scene, but the second and third act dialogue, in most cases, made up for it.

One puzzling incident which proved unjustifiable was when Stevie's "youthfulness" is restrained, not only by other members of the cast, but also by a rope.

All in all, Eugene Raskin's comedy, despite its minor shortcomings, provided an evening of diversion and uniqueness.

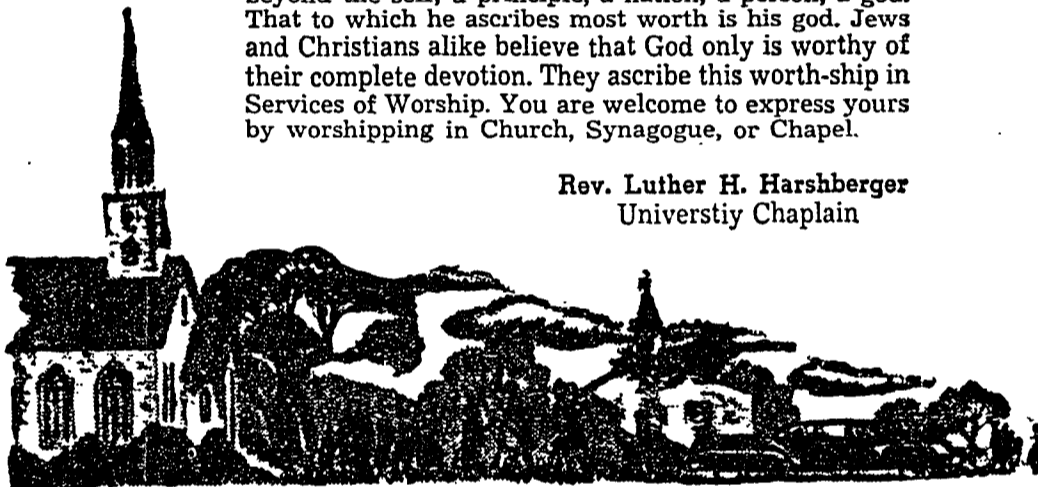
