Knowland Rips Red Repression

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Feb. 25 (AP) — Sen. William F. Knowland (R-Calif.) told the United Nations today that 20 years of Soviet repression is the true cause of tension in Eastern Europe.

Knowland, a member of the U.S. delegation, laid down a point-by-point indictment of Kremlin policy in answer to a Soviet demand that the United Nations condemn the United States for alleged subversive activity in Communist countries.

V. V. Kuznetsov, Soviet deputy foreign minister, presented a resolution to the UN Special Political Committee, asking for the condemnation action. Similar moves have been defeated by overwhelming majorities in past years.

Pittsburgh Given Television Channel

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP) — An agreement was reached today on the award of television channel 11 in Pittsburgh, paving the way for possible early construction of another TV station in the city.

Under the agreement Telecasting, Inc., withdraws all objections to allocation of the channel to WWSW, Inc., owned equally by the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette and Pittsburgh Radio Supply House.

"We're ready to proceed on 24-hour notice," Paul M. Segal, attorney for WWSW, said.

Ike Appoints Democrat W. Germany Delegate

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP) — President Dwight D. Eisenhower's appointment of a \$1,000 contributor to 1956 Democratic campaign funds as ambassador to West Germany threw Senate Republicans into an uproar tonight.

Counsel Resigns Teamsters Union

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP) — The general counsel for the Teamsters Union, J. Albert Woll, resigned today on the eve of a Senate probe into the union's affairs.

Woll said he quit because legal work for the teamsters had grown too great for him to handle and still take care of other clients.

A special Senate committee is due to open an investigation tomorrow into alleged racketeering.

Mansfield Declares U. S. Action Slow

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP) — Sen. Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.) said tonight that the Eisenhower administration is following a disastrous "formula for inertia" in relying almost wholly on the United Nations to solve the Middle East crisis.

Mansfield said the administration has shown a "lack of policy" in handling events drifting in a highly dangerous direction.

Red Police Seize Hungarians

BUDAPEST, Feb. 25 (AP) — Communist police squads arrested dozens of Hungarians who called at Western diplomatic missions today. Some were seen under escort of the police near the U.S. legation, where Josef Cardinal Mindszenty is in refuge.

Government spokesmen declined comment, but similar roundups have been staged in the past when the Communist regime was particularly anxious to cut off all contact between Hungarians and foreigners.

Many Hungarians have been visiting the American, British, French and Austrian legations every day in search of help, visas or news of relatives in the West.

Today nearly all these visitors were halted by the police near the doors of the legations and many were detained. The number was not disclosed.

About 50 policemen surrounded the area of the Austrian legation.
