

# Spring Informal Rushing Will Begin Next Week

Spring informal rushing will begin next week with a registration system different from that used in any previous season.

The Panhellenic Council decided Tuesday night to consider all women who registered for spring formal rushing

but were not ribboned, as automatically registered for informal rushing. This does not obligate these women to rush, as they may refuse invitations to visit sorority suites.

### Women Must Register

Women who did not register for formal rushing and wish to rush informally must register at the dean of women's office between women 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. today or tomorrow. There will be no fee.

Rushing will begin Monday and continue until March 22. Invitations to visit suites will be extended by telephone; bids must be sent through the dean's office. Rushes must answer bids within three days.
