

Kadis Deadline Tonight; \$650 In

The "Dick Kadis Drive" stepped up its pace yesterday in an attempt to reach the \$700 mark before the 9 o'clock deadline set for tonight. Contributions totaling \$71.60-raised the fund to \$655.49 yesterday and it is expected that the \$700 mark will be reached sometime today.

Seven contributors donated yesterday's amount with Delta Sigma Phi topping all donations with a \$15 check.

At a meeting of the Varsity "S" Club, co-sponsors of the drive along with The Daily Collegian, it was revealed that all money pledged to the drive was received with the exception of two or three. Club President Paul Roberts said last night that he expected those donations to be in shortly.

Sigma Chi still leads the fraternity and sorority "money" race with its \$30 donation. Fraternities and sororities who have not donated are asked to send in their contributions no later than tonight. All money should be sent to The Daily Collegian office or dropped off at Delta Upsilon fraternity.

A check for the total amount of money in the fund will be sent to

the Kadis family in the next few days. The family is now in debt over \$13,000 in medical bills and although the \$700 amount is far from that total it still, according to Roberts, "expresses the good will and sympathy of the Penn State student body."

Kadis suffered a cerebral hemorrhage in a Sept. 29th football game while playing for Geneva College. He has been unconscious for the past five months and is still unable to recognize members of his family. The Cleveland hospital, where Kadis is being treated, still lists his condition as "poor."
