

Pro Recommended For 'Key Expert'

Office and board probation have been recommended for a sixth-semester "key expert" who was found possessing and using master keys in Hamilton Hall.

Association of Independent Men Judicial Board of Review Tuesday night made the recommendation. Final action will be taken tomorrow by the University Senate Subcommittee on Discipline.

The student, enrolled in the division of intermediate registration, was turned in after being observed using the service elevator in Hamilton Hall.

Had Master Keys

The "key" man admitted formerly possessing four master keys to rooms and the elevator in Hamilton Hall. Officials of the University housing service also found two other keys in the student's room, one for a room in Atherton Hall.

The student said he found the two keys in the Hetzel Union Building but the master keys were obtained from a fellow student, whom he would not identify. He said he distributed the master keys among his close friends but never entered any other students' room without permission.

Two Keys Found

The student also said he heard the University was "cracking down" on students who possess duplicate keys so he collected the master keys from his friends and discarded the keys in a garbage receptacle downtown.

Upon previous questioning by housing officials the student said he had only the key to his own room but two keys were found in

a search of his room.

In addition to recommending probation, the AIM board stated that a letter would be sent to the student's parents giving an account of the incident and the action taken.

Prof Will Discuss Oak Wilt Research

Dr. C. Leonard Fergus, associate professor of botany and plant pathology, will present a summary of the past year's research on oak wilt at the annual meeting of the north Regional Oak Wilt Committee tomorrow in Chicago.

The committee has representatives from 10 agricultural experiment stations, the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Forest Service.

Some of the objectives of the committee are the correlation of research and the exchange of ideas.

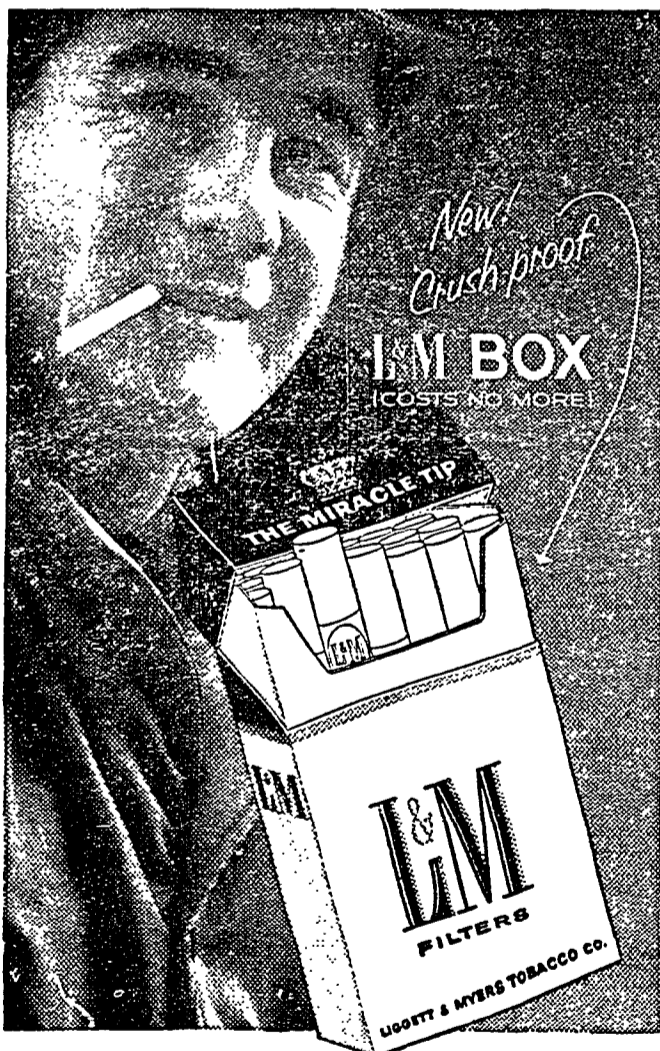
