

UCA to Sponsor Speech by Editor Hillel to Show Israeli Films

The faculty committee of the University Christian Association will sponsor a speech by Theodore A. Gill, managing editor of The Christian Century, at 8 tonight in the lounge of the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Memorial Chapel.

Dr. Gill will speak on "The Challenge of South-East Asia." He has just returned from a round-the-world tour of the Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia and Hong-kong.

The Calvary Baptist Church will hold an Annual Missionary Conference at 7:45 p.m. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at Woodman Hall.

Speakers will be the Rev. Roland Gustafsen from the Bronx, N.Y., Andrew Nelsen, missionary

to the Philippines, and Sten Lindberg, missionary to Japan. "Christian Vocations" will be the topic of discussion at a panel at 6:30 p.m. tomorrow at the Lutheran Student Center.

Panel members are Maurice S. Gjesdahl, professor of mechanical engineering; Edwin P. Nye, associate professor of mechanical engineering; and Dr. Arthur H. Reed, professor of economics.

Mass will be celebrated at 6:30 a.m. on Monday and Saturday in the Catholic Chapel of the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Memorial Chapel. The Rosary will be recited daily in the chapel at 12:45 and 4:15 p.m.

The Roger Williams Fellowship will be hosts to members of the Baptist group from Bucknell University at 6:30 p.m. tomorrow. The topic for discussion is "Conflicts on Campus." A supper will precede the meeting.

Sigma Alpha Mu fraternity will be hosts at the UJA Kickoff Brunch at noon tomorrow at the Hillel Foundation.

"That All May Be One" is the title of the Rev. Hal Leiper's speech to be delivered at 6:30 p.m. tomorrow to the Westminster Fellowship. The Reverend Leiper will discuss the growth of the Presbyterian Church and its role in the ecumenical movement.

The Wesley Foundation will hold an evening fireside forum at 6:15 p.m. tomorrow in 104 Chapel. The theme is "Concerning Others." The Foundation Council will meet at 7 p.m. Monday in the Foundation lounge.

The "Penn Stater", a 4-page newspaper, is published four times a year to inform alumni of happenings at the University. Fifty-two thousand copies are mailed to all points of the globe.

Three films on Israel will be shown at 2 p.m. tomorrow at the Hillel Foundation.

The first film, "Suez Canal," produced by Louis de Rochemont, combines cartoon techniques with photography.

"Tent City," a film written and produced by Borlick Dinar, is a tale of two boys from East and West who meet in a tent city in the Israeli desert.

The last film is a 20-minute documentary entitled, "A State is Born," in which Israeli army marching songs are sung by the Metropolitan Opera tenor, Richard Tucker. The film also includes the reading of Israel's Declaration of Independence by Abba Eban, Israeli representative to the United Nations.

The hour-long program is open to the public. No admission will be charged.

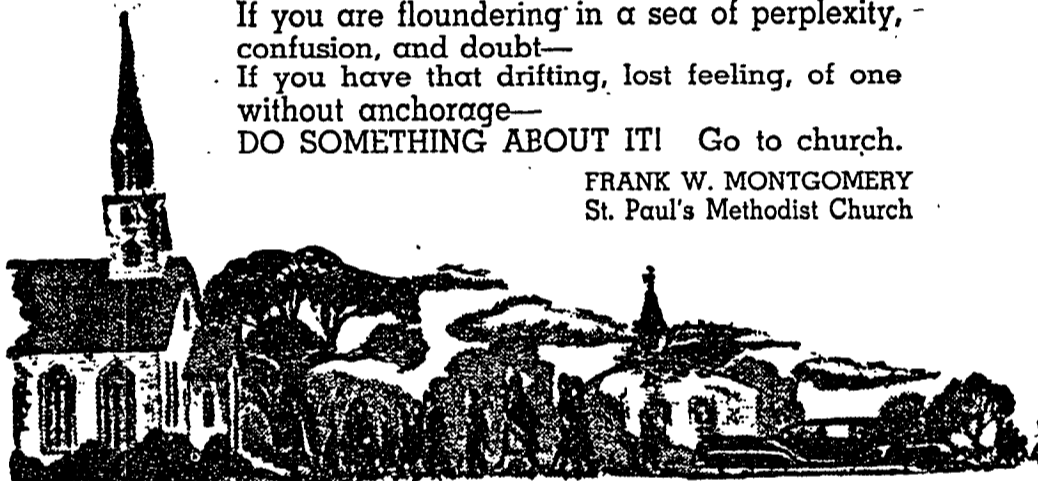
