Joe Bedenk, veteran Penn State baseball coach, won all-America football honors as an undergraduate.



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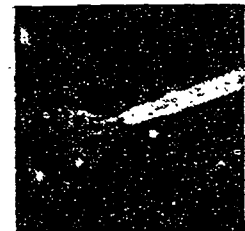
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
