## Campus Party Victory Strongest in 3 Years

Campus party has emerged from its sweeping victory in the spring elections as stronger political force than at any time during the three years of its existence.

An analysis of Thursday's election returns reveals that not one of the party's nominees for the three All-University offices won less than 60 per cent of the vote.
