

2 British West Indies Students Enjoy Living in Poultry Plant

The main advantage in living at the Central Poultry Plant, according to Percival Jackson, junior in agronomy from Jamaica, British West Indies, is that it is about as close to classes on Ag Hill as he can get.

Jackson and Masceil Beckford, juniors in agricultural education from Jamaica, British West Indies, live on the second floor of the Central Poultry Plant. The Plant is located behind the Jordan Fertility Plots and next to Nittany Dorms.

The room was originally reserved for graduate students in poultry, but in 1954 when the only poultry graduate student graduated, the room was offered to them. They decided to take it.

They are required to keep the one classroom and two laboratories in the building clean and to check the incubators during the hatching season.

The Central Poultry Plant is a far cry from the British West Indies. It was the University's promptness in answering his application that led Jackson to come here.

He had applied to several Uni-

ted States' universities, after hearing about the experiences of friends who had been in the country. The University answered his application first, and as Jackson had to have a definite place to go in order to get his leave from the British West Indies, he accepted the application. He was accepted by the other universities he applied to, but their acceptances came too late.

Jackson came to the University in the fall of 1954. The head of the Department of Agronomy helped him get his job with the poultry plant. The work is familiar to Jackson as he was in charge of the agricultural program in a

vocational high school in the British West Indies for four years before he came to the University.

Jackson spends his vacations touring the U.S. He said that he wants to see as much of the country as possible while he is here.

He has been as far west as Illinois and has visited the cities of Erie, Philadelphia, Reading, Cleveland, Ohio, Hartford, Conn. and Boston, Mass.

When asked what he thought about the Bostonian accent, Jackson said it sounded more like the English spoken in the British West Indies than any he has heard so far.
