

The World at a Glance House Airs Ike's Plan

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP) — Atty. Gen. Brownell spelled out for an apparently unconvinced Congress today President Dwight D. Eisenhower's plan of action in case a president became disabled. Eisenhower's proposal calls for a constitutional amendment to authorize the vice president to become temporary acting president. Brownell told a House Judiciary subcommittee it is "fortunate" the constitutional amendment plan probably would not become effective during Eisenhower's own term of office, so it can be considered "solely from the long-range point of view."

But Chairman Emanuel Celler (D-NY) said Congress should act quickly, simply passing a law on the subject.

Beck Attends Meeting

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP) — Dave Beck came quietly back to Washington today and went into a secret meeting of the Teamsters' Union's executive board. There was no immediate word on what the board was considering, but it was reported President Beck and other leaders of the union were debating possible withdrawal from the AFL-CIO.

British Chief Defends Policy

LONDON, April 1 (AP) — Prime Minister Harold Macmillan, in a fighting speech aimed at quelling a threatened revolt by government supporters, denied today he had sold out Britain's foreign policy rights to President Eisenhower at Bermuda. He told a restive House of Commons he entered into no secret engagements with Eisenhower, and that the Bermuda talks had no bearing on Britain's decision to free Archbishop Makarios of Cyprus. Macmillan spoke against the background of growing opposition to his Cyprus policy.

Argentina Conflict Feared Imminent

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, April 1 (AP) — President Pedro Aramburu and defiant air force officers split again tonight over a nominee for air minister. There were increasing fears that the dispute may erupt in shooting. A ceremony to swear in Commodore Eduardo Francisco McLoughlin as air minister was called off suddenly without immediate explanation.

Court Rejects Public Power

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP) — Champions of public power lost in the Supreme Court today in their fight to block private power development of the Hells Canyon area.

With only Justice Douglas dissenting, the court refused to review an order of the Federal Power Commission licensing the Idaho Power Co. to build three low level dams in the vicinity of Hells Canyon on the Snake River bordering Idaho and Oregon.

This let stand a decision of the U.S. Court of Appeals here upholding the commission's action.

Controversy has raged for almost a decade over whether the government or private interests should develop the power potential of the Snake River near Hells Canyon.

AEC Tells of Big Step In Taming of H-Bomb

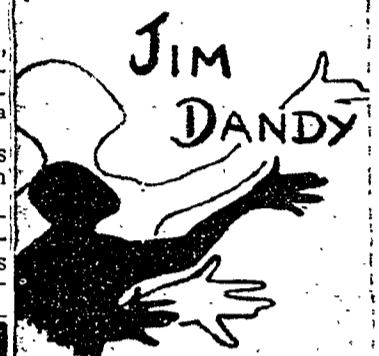
