

# Vega, McLaughlin Score Upset Wrestling Wins

Olympic gymnast Armando Vega, Beta Theta Pi, and Jim McLaughlin, Sigma Nu, registered upset wins in the talent-laden 145-pound class in last night's intramural wrestling in Recreation Hall.

Vega, national all-round gym champ, pinned the 1955 128-pound champion Tom Webb, Chi Phi, at 5:59 of a free-wheeling match. Vega led, 6-4, when he applied a body press to floor Webb just before the third-period whistle sounded.

McLaughlin stretched Phi Sigma Kappa's Al Davies, rated among the top four grapplers in the class, at the 3:40 mark.

Chi Phi's Phil Seig, last year's 175-pound king, lessened the blow suffered by teammate Webb by pinning Don Tinsman, Acacia, at 3:47 of a heavyweight bout.

Theta Chi's Dave Jones, last season's 135-pound runner-up, decided Don Moyer of Sigma Nu, 7-3, in a fast-moving match.

Bill Simon, Phi Kappa Phi, pinned 155-pound boxing champ Mike Vignola, Phi Mu Delta.

Independent Don Tuttle chalked up the evening's fastest pin, toppling Jesse Brewster in 59 seconds of a 165-pound match.

Lambda Chi Alpha's Chuck Zendt downed Frank Gansz, Phi Kappa Tau, in an even five minutes. The Lambda Chi 121-pounder led, 5-0, on a pair of takedowns and an escape, when he racked up the fall.

Indie 145-pounder Glen Klippenstein notched an impressive 6-0 decision over Bill Murray.

Another independent encounter saw Jim Birdsall stretch Pat Grippo at 3:30 of a 155-pound scrap. Birdsall held a 5-0 lead on two takedowns and an escape.

Delta Theta Sigma's Dave Jaquish pinned Lou Tronzo, Phi Gamma Delta, at the 3:42 mark.

Gene Woy, Beta Theta Pi, rolled up a 7-2 triumph over Phi Gamma's Tom West. Woy held West to a lone takedown, while scoring two reverses, a predicament and riding time.

Jack Lange, another Phi Gamma matman, pinned Pi Kappa Phi's John Schmucker in 1:27.

Footballer Bob Rice scored an escape to edge Bob Phillips, 1-0.

Fred Tener pinned Jackson Thomas at 2:16 of a 155-pound indie match.

Neil Gearhart, Phi Kappa Psi, came up with a fall against Phi Gamma Delta's Earle Henderson at the 3:15 mark. Gearhart trailed, two reverses to one, when he chalked up the pin.

Pi Kappa Alpha's Doug Chidlow posted a 5-2 decision over Bob McMath, Phi Kappa Sigma, dropping the first game, 20-21.

Hal Lynch, Sigma Phi Epsilon, scored an escape, predicament and time advantage to decision Sigma Pi's Don Gordon, 3-0.

In the forfeit column, George Campbell, Delta Tau Delta, defeated Theta Chi's Tom Eynon; Rich Boggs, Sigma Chi, topped Fred Condon, Theta Delta Chi; Jim Cline, Phi Kappa Sigma, got the nod over Phi Epsilon Pi's Stan Kaufman; and Sam Griffiths, Sigma Nu, automatically advanced to the semifinals when Delta Upsilon's John Rusnak forfeited because of a rib injury.

# Burke's 71 Tops Masters

AUGUSTA, Ga., April 4 (AP)—Perennially boyish Jackie Burke, 34, who won his first big golf title on another windy day here last year, shot through Georgia's tricky gusts into the first day lead in defense of his Masters championship.

On a day when the rising and falling breeze made a lot of golf's great players miserable, the Texan tamed the weather and par with an opening round of 71 that gave him a one-stroke lead over five tough pursuers.

Par for the handsome 6,980 yard Augusta National course is 36-36-72. And Burke was the only player to beat it today. It was the highest score the first-round leader has made in 21 years of playing the Masters.

and Jackie made it with a 35-36-71 that included an eagle.

Breathing down the defending champion's neck after the first round were two men who have won the Masters three times each, Jimmy Demaret and Sam Snead; Doug Ford, the 1955 PGA champion, and two distinguished Australian players, Peter Thomson, winner of the British Open championship for the past three years, and Bruce Crampton, 21, champion of his native country.

One of the principal victims was two-time Masters champion Ben Hogan, who posted a 76 and said he "couldn't hit the ball very close to the hole." Open champion Cary Middlecoff was even worse off with a 79.

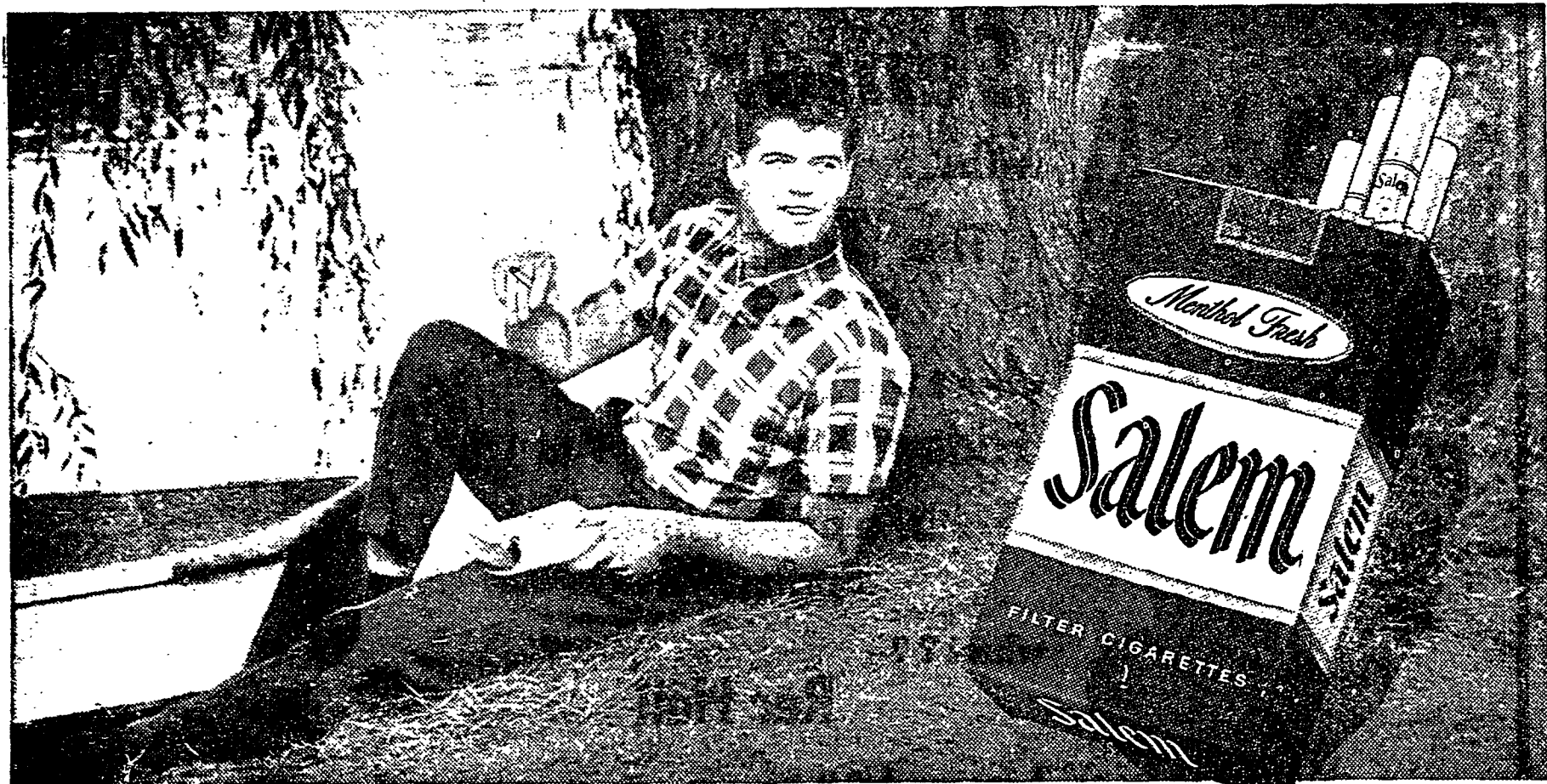
