University to Host NSA Conference

The Spring Regional Assembly of the National Student Association will be held April 26, 27 and 28 at the University, with about 100 delegates from 25 member schools in Pennsylvania and West Virginia attending.

The theme of the conference will be "Current Issues in Higher Education," according to Edwin Henrie, regional assembly coordinator.

It is not yet known whether the University's student government will have official delegates at the conference, Henrie said.

NSA Vetoes

The Table is sponsored annually by Theta Sigma Phi, national women's professional journalism fraternity, to honor outstanding women on campus.

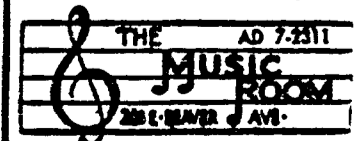
Marion Nickles, associate editor of The Saturday Evening Post, will be the guest speaker.
