

# Wrestling Enters Semi-finals

Lambda Chi Alpha tied Sigma Nu for the lead in the Intramural wrestling tournament last night with 61 points. Both fraternities will send five men into the semi-final round beginning tonight.

Lambda Chi tallied eight points in Tuesday night's competition when Jack Calderone scored a fall and Gene Hilty posted a decision victory.

Sigma Nu entered the quarter-final action with 56 points. They advanced Edwin McLaughlin with a decision at 145 pounds, picking up only 3 points.

In third place in the team race is Delta Upsilon with 50 points and two men entering the semi's; fourth is the defending champion Chi Phi with 47 points and three entrants; fifth is Beta Theta Pi with 45 points and two survivors.

Heavyweight Jack Calderone scored a lightning-fast fall over Theta Kappa Phi's Richard Tkatch at the 1:15 mark of the second period. Tkatch registered a leg-pickup takedown in the first and was in control when Calderone quickly reversed and applied a body press and reverse nelson.

In another very fast and active bout, Gene Hilty used a point time advantage to down Dick McDonald, Alpha Gamma Rho, 2-1, and score Lambda Chi's second win.

McLaughlin, Sigma Nu, used a cradle to pin Doug Chidlow.

Pi Kappa Alpha, at the 5:35 mark while ahead 5-1.

Kappa Sigma's Rowland Wilkinson established himself as a top contender at 145 pounds when he outfought Don Deckman, Delta Theta Sigma, 7-4.

Rallying for six points in the third period, Tom Williams, Delta Theta Sigma, tripped Dick Berkeley, Kappa Sigma, 8-6, at 135 pounds.

Another 135-pound contender, Acacia's Jim Hart, easily decided Joe Bellwoar, Pi Kappa Phi, 5-0.

Richard Boggs, Sigma Chi, reversed Delta Theta Sigma's David Jaquish in the third period and scored a 6-5 victory in a 165-pound match.

At 175 pounds, Bob Wenner, Pi Kappa Phi, tallied an escape and takedown in the second period to defeat George Sifter.

Sigma Chi, 3-1.

In a top 135-pound encounter, David Jones, Theta Chi, defeated Eugene Woy, Beta Theta Pi, 5-2, on the strength of a fine second period.

Delta Upsilon lost the services of Bill Griffin at 155 pounds when Phi Delta Theta's Thomas Burns posted a 3-0 decision victory.

At 155-pounds Fred Tener decided Jim Birdsall, 2-0; and Bob Altman pinned Charles Semian in 4:25. Allen Gordon advanced into the semi's at 128 pounds with a second period fall over Thomas Rathmel.

Allan Larson scored a 10-4 win over Ron DeFelice at 135 pounds; while winning forfeits were Neil Gearhart, Phi Kappa Psi, over Bill Simon, Pi Kappa Phi; and indies Don McCreary over Don Sullivan and Sam Fry over Charles Rosimi.

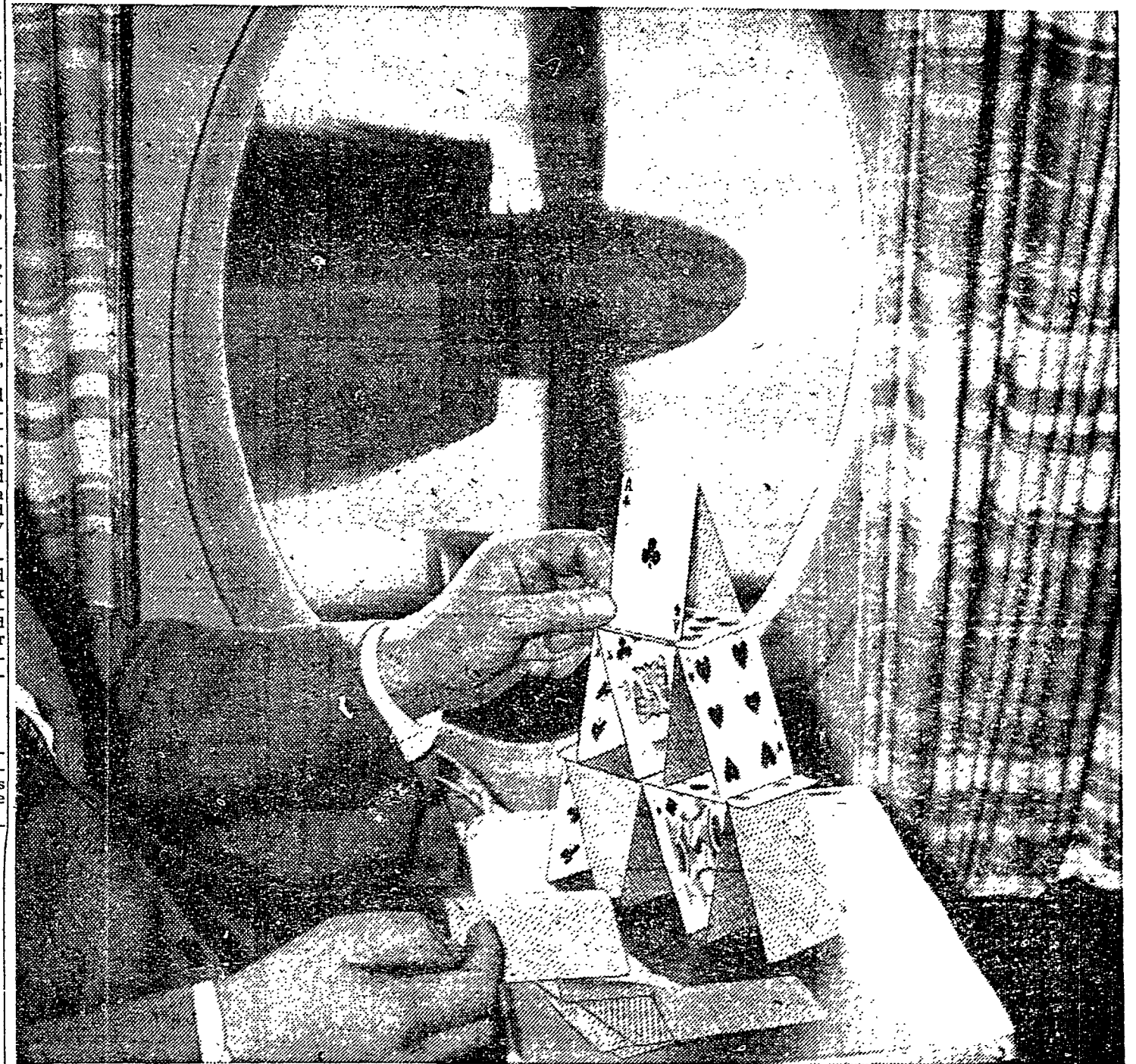
