

He-Man, Queen of Hearts Applications Due Monday

Applications for the He-Man Contest and the "Queen of Hearts" tournament will be due Monday at the Hetzel Union desk, according to John Heinze, He-Man chairman of Spring Week.

Sponsoring groups may obtain application blanks at the HUB desk.

The preliminary events of the He-Man contest, will be held on April 28 at Beaver Field, with the 100-yard dash and the shot-put. The first ten men in each event will receive points in the order of their finish. The ten men with the highest combined scores will be qualified for the finals.

The final events, to be held on May 1 at Beaver Field, will be the 100-yard dash, the shot-put, the bench press and the steeplechase.

10 Points for First Place
The scoring system for the final events will be 10 points for first place, nine for second, eight for third, seven for fourth and six for the rest of the finalists.

The scoring system has been changed in order to reduce the possibility of a tie for the first four places. Previously the first place winner received 10 points, second place winner five points, third place winner three points and the other six finalists two points.

In case of rain both the preliminary and final events will be held at Recreation Hall, and the preliminary events will include a three-lap track event and the bench press. The final events will be the bench press, the broad jump, chin ups on the horizontal bar and a four lap track event.

Track Athletes Excluded
Any student who has won a letter in track or cross-country, who is a member of the freshman or varsity squad of these sports or is a past He-Man winner is ineligible.

'Olympics' Set By Riding Club

The Riding Club will present the fourth annual modified Olympic three-day event tomorrow and Sunday.

Riders from the Blue Ridge Hunt Club in Virginia will be competing against University riders. This event is the only one of its kind held by a college or university.

The three-day event is patterned after that held in the Equestrian Olympics, but it is held only on two days.

The first "day," Saturday morning, consists of dressage in the ring to test the training of the horse. The second "day," Saturday afternoon, is a 13-mile cross-country endurance test over roads, trails and natural obstacles. The third "day," Sunday afternoon, features open jumping in the ring. The event is open to the public.

"Queen of Hearts" tournament will be a 50-yard dash. The first ten girls placing in this event will qualify their group to enter the final event, which will be a duffel bag race.

Two coeds will comprise one team. One coed will run a distance of 30 yards to a duffel bag full of peculiar clothing. She will dress herself, return to the starting point, exchange the clothes with her partner. Her partner will remove the clothing and repack it in the duffel bag.

Jewelry Among Clothing
The clothing will include such articles as men's shoes, flashy socks, trousers, jewelry, hats and shirts.

The winner of the He-Man Contest will receive 15 points toward Spring Week, the second place winner 10 points, third place winner seven points, and each of the other finalists two points. The winner of the coed event will receive five points toward Spring Week. Each group will receive one point for placing two entries, one in each event.

Trophies will be awarded to the winners of both the He-Man Contest and the "Queen of Hearts" tournament. The nine He-Man finalists will receive medals.

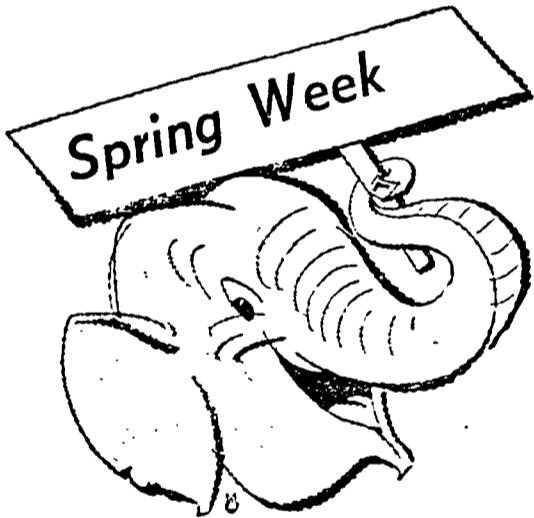
