

# Stone Valley Camp to Be Classroom

Several thousand acres of University property in a wilderness area with wild animals, sparkling brooks and trails leading into nearby mountains will be the classroom for about 70 sixth grade pupils this spring.

The "classroom" is the Civil Engineering Camp in Stone Valley, about nine miles west of State College. The pupils will come from the McVeytown and Matternville school districts, which are cooperating in the University's School Camping and Outdoor Education Project.

**Begun Last Fall**  
The project was undertaken last fall as a continuous program to be conducted each fall and spring semester by the College of Education, the College of Physical Education and Athletics and other cooperating agencies.

The camp staff for each week includes the regular teacher of each participating class, University professors who serve as program directors, and six seniors, three majoring in elementary education and three in recreation education.

Herman C. Kranzer, assistant

professor of nature education, will be program director of the camp from April 29 to May 3. Fred M. Coombs, professor of recreation education, and Harold B. White, associate professor of recreation education, will be program directors from May 6 to May 10.

### Camp Divided

The camp is divided into a boys' and girls' area. Pupils live in tents erected on permanent concrete platforms and have such conveniences as electricity, clothes lockers, and folding metal cots complete with mattresses and pillows. Each tent accommodates four campers.

Lavatory facilities with hot water for showers are provided in each area. The main lodge includes a dining hall, kitchen, classroom and dispensary. A full-time registered nurse is in the

camp on 24-hour duty and a State College doctor is on call.

The main purposes of the program are to provide the children with an opportunity to learn to live democratically with other children and adults; to help them understand and appreciate the out-of-doors; to teach them the rules of healthful living; to make instruction in such fields as science, mathematics, social science and music more meaningful; and to develop better teacher-pupil understanding.

To fulfill these objectives, the activities in the program involve conservation of such natural resources as soil, fish, water, game, and forests; use of maps and compasses; learning outdoor living skills concerned with cooking, hiking, and studying natural surroundings; and group work projects.

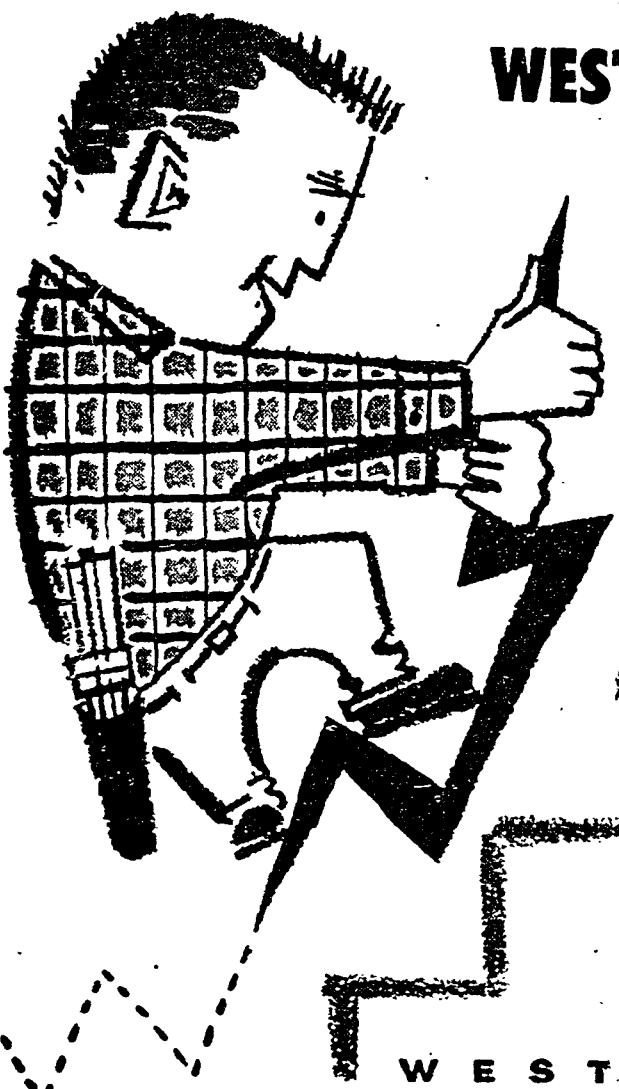
