

# Dennis Sees Contact With Centers by TV

Lawrence E. Dennis, vice president for academic affairs, said Saturday he envisions in the future a television network for the University and its centers to cope with the dual problem of teacher shortage and growing enrollment.

The network, he said, would consist of both closed circuit and broadcast systems.

This is in line with a prediction made by educators which he related to the Spring Regional Assembly of the National Student Association—that college enrollment in the next 15 years would triple, from three million to nine or 10 million.

**No Summer Vacations**  
Another way he expects the University to cope with the problem is through a reorganization of the program—doing away with the long summer vacation and instituting a system of either quarters or trimesters.

There is no present need for the summer vacation, Dennis said, nor is there any reason why class hours cannot be changed to enable a student to finish undergraduate work in considerably less than four years.

Under a quarter system, he said, one quarter could be used either for going to school or working. This, he said would enable studying engineers to find part time work more easily by staggering the rush of vacationing students.

**Student Problems**  
Not only is there a problem in the number of students, Dennis said, but also a problem in the changing character of the students.

Today's freshmen, he said, are not familiar with the global wars that seemed a way of life to slightly older students. But, he said, they are in the midst of international tensions with which they must be prepared to deal.

As an example, he said that present-day tensions have their root in the Far and Middle East,

and there is a glaring lack of studies offered in the fields of Middle Eastern, Asian and African history and politics.

He also said the students—tomorrow's leaders—must become thoroughly acquainted with the totalitarian ideologies that are challenging the world's free institutions.
