Tickets will be good only up to 10 minutes before the ceremony when persons without tickets will be seated on a first-come basis.

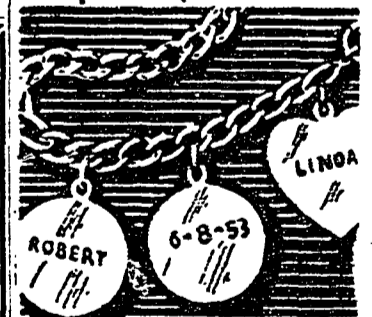
