

Tennis Court Landscaping Will Begin Next Week

LA Faculty To Discuss General Ed

Three reports concerning the College of the Liberal Arts' current general education in art, the humanities and the social sciences, will be given at a meeting of the Liberal Arts faculty at 4:10 p.m. today in 121 Sparks.

Dr. Winston R. Weisman, assistant professor of history of art and architecture; Dr. Henry A. Finch, professor of philosophy; and Dr. Howard A. Cutler, professor of economics, will present the reports.

To Discuss New Courses
New courses to be added in the college, including several new journalism courses, will also be discussed.

A report will be presented concerning the new scholarship regulations for students in the college including the All-University average which will make a person liable for expulsion.

The faculty will elect a representative to the University Senate to replace Dr. Kent Forster, professor of European history, who is on leave.

Matson Elected
Dean Ben Euwema said Dr. Forster had been expected to return by the fall semester 1957 and Dr. Frederick R. Matson, professor of archaeology, was elected to fill the post until then.

However, Dr. Forster will not return in the fall, so the post must again be filled by an elected representative, Euwema said.

As a result of the faculty's recent decision to allow reporters from The Daily Collegian to cover the meetings, a reporter will be present today for the first time.

Traffic Count To Be Taken For Practice

Students working on the campus traffic survey will make practice traffic counts this week in preparation for the actual counts next Monday and Friday.

These practice counts will be taken at any time convenient to the student. They will serve as a "dry run" to prevent errors during the survey.

Almost Enough Students
Calvin G. Reen, professor of civil engineering and director of the survey, said last night at a meeting of volunteers from the Sophomore Class Advisory Board that he has almost enough students to fill the survey.

He said very few employees of the Department of Physical Plant would have to be utilized.

Students to Be Paid
Students working on the survey will receive \$1.50 an hour both for the practice counts and the survey itself.

In addition to the student counts, automatic traffic counters lent by the Department of Highways will operate throughout the week at 14 stations.

Installed This Week
These counters will be installed late this week, according to Reen. Pedestrian counts will be taken at 25 stations Friday May 17, during periods of approximately 45 minutes each.

These counts will record the direction as well as the volume of pedestrian traffic.

This year's exposition is dedicated to Bruce Baldwin, president of the Milk Industry Foundation and vice president of Abbotts Dairy in Philadelphia.
