

# Air Cadets To Receive 19 Awards

Nineteen students in the Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corps will receive awards at a ceremony at 3 p.m. today at Beaver Field.

These awards are in recognition of outstanding scholastic ability, military achievement and character.

The Outstanding Air Force ROTC Medals for each of the four classes will be awarded to Norman Kahn, freshman; Jess Clarke, sophomore; Charles Nycum, junior; and Thomas Dye, senior.

### Convair Award of Merit

William Barr will receive the Convair Award of Merit. Herbert Black and Arthur Tennyson will receive the Chicago Tribune Gold Medals and Stratton Karahalias and Allan Gilbert will receive Silver Medals.

### Construction Problem

Another problem was constructing the teahouse, which has to be put together by actors during the final act. The roof has been suspended by wires and metal hooks on the side enabling the cast to hang the silk screens and walls quickly.

According to Reifsnider, a "Teahouse of the August Moon" is now doing a profitable business on Okinawa following the successful staging of the play in Japan.

Members of the cast include Julie Lee as Lotus Blossom, the wily Geisha Girl who helps "demilitarize" Capt. Fisby, played by George Vlachos. Miss Lee was born in Shankai, China, and helped letter the Oriental emblems on the helmets of the villagers.

Tickets for the play are on sale at the Hetzel Union desk at 60 cents for tonight's performance and \$1.25 for tomorrow and Saturday nights.

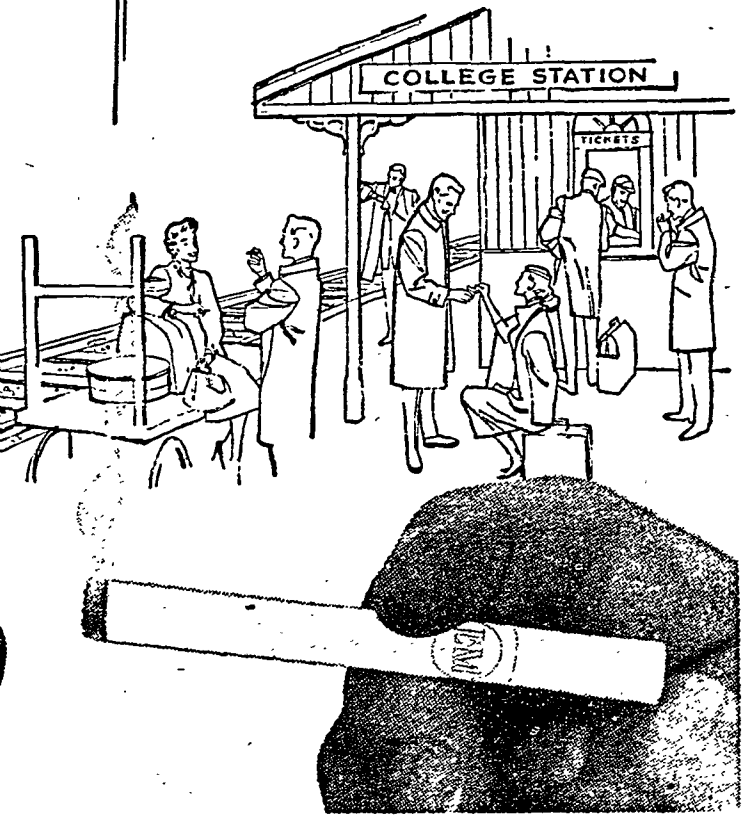
