To Visit United Nations

One week of the workshop will be devoted to the Middle East, another to Latin America and a third to Africa. A week's study of the United Nations will be highlighted by a 3-day trip to the United Nations headquarters in New York City.

Among the guest speakers will be Guillermo Nannetti, educational secretary of the Pan-American Union. The Rev. James H. Robinson, executive director of the Morningside Heights Community Center, New York City, will address the joint meeting of the workshop and the School Superintendents and Principals Conference on July 23.

38 Participated Last Year

Other speakers will be announced later. The workshop will also include discussions, films and other audio-visual materials and assigned reading.

The 1956 workshop had 38 participants, including a core of 18 summer session students for the entire 6-week period. There were two delegations from abroad, including three educators from Bolivia and 13 guests from Belgium, France and French possessions. Representatives of the World Brotherhood Organization and the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia also attended.
