

# Chapel Choir to Sing Modern Hymns Poet's Wife to Speak Tuesday

The Chapel Choir, instead of presenting its traditional Spring program of an oratorio or mass, will emphasize the works of contemporary American composers in its 10th annual Spring Concert at 8:30 p.m. Thursday in Schwab Auditorium.

Roy Harris, noted American composer, and Paul Nordoff have written hymns especially for the Choir. Harris will direct the Choir in the singing of his composition, "Psalm 150."

The Choir, directed by Willa C. Taylor, will also sing a series of five contemporary American hymns which will be heard for the first time in the Thursday night concert.

Three of them, "I Thank You, God," "A Little Innocence," and

"Heaven," are the compositions of Paul Nordoff and were commissioned for the Choir.

These works and two others were among the compositions submitted for the "American Hymnal," which will be published soon by the University of Chicago Press. The hymnal was edited by Albert Christ-Janer, director of the School of the Arts, and Carlton Sprague Smith, head of the music division of the New York Public Library.

Doors to Open at 8  
Also to appear in the program will be 15th century and early American hymns.

The doors for the concert will open at 8 p.m. and seats not reserved will be available to the public at 8:15. There will be a reserved section for special guests and parents of choir members. Much of the program on Thurs-

day night will be taken from the program the Choir has been preparing for its second European tour.

**European Tour**  
Sixty-six of those who will sing in the concert will be touring Europe with the Choir this summer. They will leave June 18 from New York, N.Y.

Among the places where the Choir will appear are London, York, Edinburgh and Oxford in England; Paris, France; Braunschweig, Switzerland; Venice, Italy; Munich and Berlin, Germany; and Amsterdam, Holland. The group will return July 31.
