

Altar May Be Financed With Senior Class Gift

Fourth of a Series

An altar that could be lowered through the floor in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Memorial Chapel may be financed by the Senior class gift of \$10,000.

Funds for the Chapel are one of five suggestions selected by the Senior Class Advisory Board for the class gift.

Dr. Luther H. Harshbarger, University chaplain, said yesterday that specific gifts for the chapel might include the elevator-altar for the proposed main chapel or stained glass windows for the meditation chapel.

The purpose of the movable altar would be to facilitate the presentation of plays, concerts, or television. Tentative plans call for the altar to be placed at the front of the chancel with a communion rail for 250 persons surrounding it.

To Seat 2000

The chancel will be as wide as the nave, which will seat about 2000. The seating arrangement was designed so that the altar will serve as the main focal point of the chapel, Dr. Harshbarger said.

Seats for a choir of 100 will be behind the altar. The chancel will also be used to seat 200 additional persons when the nave is filled, Dr. Harshbarger said.

Dr. Harshbarger also suggested that the class gift could be designated for stained glass windows in the meditation chapel. Stained glass for the eight side windows would cost \$2000 apiece; the main window in the rear of the chapel would cost \$5000.

Design Being Made

Sybil D. Emerson, associate professor of art education, is now working on a design "appropriate to the style of architecture of the chapel and in abstract" Dr. Harshbarger explained.

Three of the four latest class gifts have been given to the chapel. They include an organ and chancel and nave furnishings and total approximately \$27,000.

The \$100 million over-all cut was made by the committee in an attempt to reduce the \$2 billion-plus state budget.
