

## Court Levies \$37 in Fines

A total of \$37 was collected at the final meeting of Traffic Court last night.

A total of \$19 was collected for traffic violations—\$15 for failure to register or display registration stickers and \$3 for failure to report to the Campus Patrol office within the next complete school day.

Ten students had a total of \$51 fines suspended. Twelve failed to appear before the court and lost their right to appeal. They were fined a total of \$37. Thirteen cases were dismissed.

The total amount of fines collected for the year through May 14 is \$5907. Traffic violations involving students between now and the end of the semester will be handled by the dean of men's office.
