To Live in Hamilton Men students applying for both housing and food service will be housed in Hamilton; those wishing only housing will be assigned to McAllister or Watts.


Women applicants for the com-

Residence halls may be occupied between 3 and 8 p.m. the day preceding registration for each summer session.


