

200 Coeds Crowd Into WSGA Meeting

Nearly 200 women students crowded into 105 White Building last night for the Women's Student Government Association's first open meeting of the year.

Mrs. R. Mae Shultz, assistant dean of women, attributed the increased interest to the stress of the importance of student government made by the counselors to the new students during Orientation Week.

Suzanne Smith, WSGA president, using posters for illustration, discussed the purpose and activities of each of the WSGA committees.

The committees are the WSGA implementation committee, the committee for the student handbook sponsored by WSGA, publicity committee, the Intercollegiate Association of Women Students committee and Freshman Tea committee.


