President Dwight D. Eisenhower and Eric A. Walker, president of the University, will open the President's Conference on Technical and Distribution Research for the Bene-fit of Small Business at noon Monday in Washington, D.C.

Walker, general chairman of the conference, also serves on an action committee with Ossian R. MacKenzie, dean of the College

of Business Administration and Robert H. Ramsey, professor of engineering research.

The committee has been appointed to launch an "action program" after the Washington conference.

To Assess Aids The conference, growing out of a recommendation by a Cabinet Committee on Small Business appointed last year by Eisenhower, will take up the task of assessing research and development aids available to small businesses through government departments state and private universities and other private agencies.

Another task will be to recom-

mend measures for extending such aid to small firms over the whole range of management.


500 Army Tickets On Sale Monday
