Allies to Check Mid-East Thrust

LONDON, Sept. 23 (AP)—The United States and five Baghdad Pact allies began charting new moves today to head off anti-Western thrusts in the Middle East.

Delegates from the six anti-Communist countries considered secret intelligence reports assessing Soviet penetration in Syria, Egypt, Yemen and other Arab trouble spots.

One of these reports suggested that Red agents, working from centers in Syria, have become active among dissatisfied elements of the Lebanese and Jordanian populations. The Communist intention, the reports said, clearly appears to be the overthrow of the pro-Western governments in those two Arab states bordering Syria.

Mine Explosion Kills One Man, 5 Still Missing

WASHINGTON, Pa., Sept. 23 (AP)—A searing explosion ripped underground workings of a south-western Pennsylvania coal mine today, trapping 11 mine foremen and workers far below the surface.

The body of one man, George Demko, of Marianna, was recovered from the mine more than 10 hours after the 7:15 a.m. blast.

Five men were rescued from a perch in the mine 565 feet underground. They were given emergency treatment, then taken to Washington hospital.

Five men were yet listed as missing.

Cause and exact nature of the explosion were not determined immediately.

5 Survive Storm In Mid-Atlantic

HAMBURG, Germany, Sept. 23 (AP)—A U.S. freighter rescued five survivors of the German bark Pamir today from a lifeboat they shared with five dead men.

Lights and flares spotted in mid-Atlantic raised hopes that others of the 86-man crew lived through the hurricane that struck the four-masted sailing ship 550 miles west-southwest of the Azores.

The Isbrandtsen Lines freighter Saxon made the first rescue in the hunt under way since the Pamir radioed an SOS Saturday.

Canadian Outlines 'Friendship' Policy

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y., Sept. 23 (AP)—Canada's Conservative Prime Minister John G. Diefenbaker outlined to the U.N. today a foreign policy based on traditional friendship with the United States and cooperation with NATO.

He said that U.S.-Canadian relations provide an irrefutable answer "to those who contend that the United States is aggressive and seeks territorial advantage and ferments war."

Eisenhower Admonishes Against World Inflation

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23 (AP)—President Eisenhower declared today that the "worldwide phenomenon" of inflation must be curbed before it spins into a depression.

Eisenhower set up the warning in a sober talk opening the twelfth annual meeting of the 64-nation World Bank and International Monetary Fund.
