London, bass baritone with the Metropolitan Opera Association, will give the second concert of the student-sponsored Artists' Series at 8:30 tonight in Schwab Auditorium. The doors will open at 8.

To open the program, London will sing two arias by Mozart, "Madamina" and "The Schampagne Aria," both from Don Giovanni.

Four songs by Franz Schubert will make up the second part of the concert. They are "Der Atlas," "Standchen," "Der Doppelganger" and "Die Allnacht."

After the Schubert songs, London will sing two arias, one from Macbeth by Verdi and the other from Tales of Hoffman by Offenbach.

Three songs by Maurice Ravel will comprise the next part of the program. The set of songs is titled "Don Quichotte: A Dulcinee."

For his closing selections, London will sing "They Call the Wind Mariah" from Paint Your Wagon, "There But for You Go I" from Brigadoon and "Soliloquy" from Carousel.

London, who made his Metropolitan debut in 1951, has sung throughout this country and Europe. He has appeared at the music festivals in Bayreuth, Salzburg, Glyndebourne, Edinburgh, Munich and Aix-en-Provence.

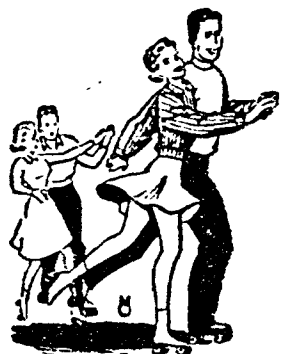
He has also appeared on television on such programs as the Telephone Hour and The Voice of Firestone.

# Old Spotted Cow Sets Record For Milk, Butter Production

The goose that laid the golden egg has nothing on Penstate Inka Pathfinder Star, a University holstein cow whose milk butterfat production has set a new record.

Pathfinder Star is the first holstein in history to set six consecutive records of over 20,000 pounds of milk and 1000 pounds of butterfat per year.

Her official record was made on three milkings a day started at the age of 12 years, eight months through the University's Herd Improvement Registry program under the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

The association ranked Star the third living lifetime producer in butterfat and one of the greatest living leaders in milk production. At the close of her new record her lifetime production totals 210,394 pounds

of milk and 8870 pounds of butterfat.

Her production is more than eight times the career output of the average dairy cow or enough milk and butter to meet the needs of an average family for about 210 years.

Demurely chewing her cud, the gentle old cow is mum about her unprecedented production but Dr. W. H. Cloninger, associate professor of dairy production, says her success is due to four factors: genetic inheritance, feeding, care and management and health.

No newcomer to the limelight, Star was a cover girl on the State Holstein News magazine and earned a write-up in the Holstein-Friesian World magazine last year.

She is outstanding in type as well as in production and has been officially classified "Excellent," the highest possible rating in the Holstein Herd Classification program.

A University resident all her life, Star also ranks as a top brood cow and can be proud of a family of four sons, four daughters, 16 grandsons and 228 granddaughters.

## Fire Victims Seek Homes

Two of three student families, each of which have babies ranging from four to six weeks old, are seeking another place to live after fire extensively damaged their apartments Friday morning at 134 S. Gill St.

Kenneth Dretsch, a third floor occupant, who planned to bring his wife and four-week-old baby to State College last weekend, is living with relatives in the area. The fire which totaled approximately \$8000 damage was centered on the third floor.

Anthony Gianni, whose family lived on the second floor, is living in his apartment until another can be obtained. He took his wife and child to his parents' home in Philadelphia.

Mr. and Mrs. Orrin Main, residents of the first floor with their four-week-old child, are remaining in the apartment.
