

Kilpatrick Will Open Graduate Lectures

Dr. William Kilpatrick, dean of American educators and one of the founders of the modern school of education, will open the Graduate School lecture series at 8 p.m., Oct. 23 in 121 Sparks.

Kilpatrick will speak on "Modern Education; What it Stands For and Why."

Dr. Dexter Perkins, eminent historian associated with the Universities of Rochester, Cornell and Harvard, is also scheduled for the series.

Perkins will speak on "The Foreign Policy of the United States Today" at 8 p.m. Nov. 12 in 121 Sparks.

Dr. Walter H. Judd, Republican congressman from Minnesota, a member of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, and a former medical missionary in Asia, will speak at 8 p.m. Nov. 13 in Schwab Auditorium.

Judd will speak on "A Reappraisal of Foreign Aid."

Dr. William Turner, former dean of the School of Social Work, University of Pennsylvania, "Social Work in a Dynamic World," 8 p.m. Feb. 11, 121 Sparks.

Dr. H. Bently Glass, professor of genetics, Johns Hopkins University and recent past president of the American Institute of Biological Sciences, "New Horizons in Human Genetics," 8 p.m. March 3, 121 Sparks.

Dr. Otto Will Jr., director of psychotherapy, Chestnut Lodge, Rockville, Md., "Human Relatedness and the Schizophrenic Reaction."

The lectures are open to the public.

Lit Magazine Named Circa; Revises Style

Circa is the new name for the revamped University literary magazine, the old Lantern, Robert Nurock, editor-in-chief, announced last night.

The name, a derivative from the Latin, means "about" and signifies the wider scope of format that the magazine hopes to achieve. The content will be "about everything," including fiction, non-fiction, technical articles and poetry, Nurock said.

He told more than 20 candidates at the general information meeting that Circa hoped to benefit from the "experimental two years" of its predecessor, the Lantern.

Nurock termed Circa an "all University magazine, which has been totally lacking from this college community."

The first issue of Circa, on Dec. 18, will include a 4-page art section and articles by faculty members.
